Wednesday June 14th 1837
Light winds from N to R & working to the South taking ship as requisite at midnight the North head of Albatross bore East Dist. by Est. 14 miles 4 ships and a Brig in sight off the mouth of Lee bay 2 of them boiling whales All hoisted in the Starboard boat to repair and paint hoisted out a spare boat of the



Thursday June 15th 1837
Commenced with fresh South winds and slowly steaming to the N.W. at 4 P.M. raised a dead whale to cut to cut All turned up the Waste boat to repair Ends with clear weather saw finbacks
Lat by Obs 5:02 South

Friday June 16th 1837
These 24 hours steady winds from the S.E. hauling up B & W carpenter employed repairing and painting the L. B. and Waste Boat saw finbacks
Lat by Obs 1:54 S

Saturday June 17th 1837
These 24 hours strong S.E. trades and puffing clouds P.M. finished the Mast and Starboard boats All hoisted in the Bow Boat to repair and paint 20 mds
These 24 hours
Lat by Obs 3:10 S

Off Shore on a Cruise

Sunday June 18th 1837
Strong S.E. trades and puffing clouds Steering off S.W. by W. P.M. finished the Bow Boat and hoisted her out All saw finbacks breaching at 6 P.M. took in topgallant sails and flying jib
Lat by Obs 4:00 South

Monday June 19th 1837
~~Commenced with strong trade winds and rough sea at 5 P.M. took 1 reef off the topsails Bore S.W. by W. Middle part more moderate set the main topgallant sail saw finbacks
Lat by Obs 4:40 S
Long by Ch = 99° 20' W~~

Tuesday June 20th 1837
Begins with moderate gales and clear steering W & W latter part ship breezes
Lat by Obs 5:16 S
Long 101° 30' W est

Wednesday June 21st 1837
These 24 hours strong S.E. trades with now and then a rain squall at 7 A.M. were to the S.E. saw nothing
Lat by Obs 5:30 S

Thursday June 22nd 1837
Winds and weather as yesterday standing on the wind and taking ship as requisite nothing in sight
