1837

Good whale weather nothing in sight

Saturday
August 12th

Nothing in sight

Sunday
August 13th

Spoke Ship Eliza. Arrived
Horse 20 months out 2600 lbs
Spoke ship William D. Eliza
29 month out 1100 Lat 51° 28'
Long 101° 30' W

Monday

August 14th

2 ships in sight no whales

Tuesday

August 15th

Saw 1 ship employed grafting
a pair of new (Tide) T. mast
staysail pendant making them
line A
Lat by A 51° 14' S

Whaling in the North Pacific 27

Wednesday

August 16th
1837

Fresh trades and clear weather
at 6 AM bore up and ran
SW under single reefed topsails
and courses saw 2 ships to
the windward of us no whales

It looks frosty

Lat by A 51° 20' S
Long 102° 00' West

Thursday

August 17th
1837

Wind and weather as yesterday
running off S by E at 6 AM bore to
the North and hauled the M.
Course & jib at day light set the
Main course

Lat by A 51° 20' South

Friday

August 18th
1837

Moderate trades with a heavy
swell from the S & S latter part
Strong trades single reefs in
nothing in sight

Lat by A 51° 58' S

Saturday
August 19th

Strong trades with an uncommon
in trough something seen on at
6 PM raised a large school
of whales going eye out to
windward followed by boats
did not succeed in fastening
A ship in sight standing off
as we are at 6 PM hauled the
M. Course latter part made the
same as the first

Lat by A 51° 00' S
