October 29th Finished painting out side
All the weather thick and
cool.

Monday
October 30th 1837 Nothing to do on account of
the water pipes being
out of repair on shore which
will detain us a few days
before we can obtain our fresh
water.

Tuesday
October 31st 1837 These 24 hours pleasant weather
and fine weather.

Wednesday
October 1st 1837 all hands rafting and stowing
away fresh water took 1200
on board to day

Thursday
Nov 2nd Finished watering took 1800
on board to day and stored
it away

Anchored in the Harbour of Callao

Friday
November 3rd 1837 Pele took on board 8 tons of
potatoes

Thursday
November 4th Boating off potatoes cabbages &
Onions

Monday
November 5th Pleasant weather Liberty on
shore for 1 watch

Monday
November 6th 1837 Made all ready for sea

Tuesday
November 7th Discharged 6 men and shipped
4 in place of them

Wednesday
November 8th At 5 Pele got under weigh
with 8 wind from the S.E.
and stood out to sea
All unbent the chains and
lashed the anchors loose through
the night 4 M by 4 at day the
Las Hornigas Islands in sight bearing
S.W. dist 15 miles at midday course West
S.W. by S
