whales going to the
boward. Lowered and
killed 1 of them
B. Boat 25 lbs Lat 4^h 30'

Saturday Baffling winds with
February some rain employed
3rd 1837 cutting boiling &c at
muzzell. Cooled down
the works for the want
of blubber at ends with caution

Sunday Bays with light trawls and
February cloudy weather heading to the
4th South Pole washed ship
1837 latter part rainy
heading S. E. Lat 5^h 30'

Monday All A steady rain
February with moderate winds
5 heading up E. & S. E.
at 7 AM. hauled south
Spoke Ship & box of
Harvae (France) 6 months out
bounced to the S. W. east. A right
wheeling

Lat by obs 5^h 09'
Long 105^h 00' West

Tuesday Windless these 24 hours light
February trawls and clear standing
1st 1837 to the S. E. nothing in
sight Lat 4^h 44'
