27th
1837 P. M. Steer saw a ship to
the S. E. of us Middle and
Latter part calm and hot
making it quite uncomfort-
able working watches employed
making new foot ropes port
ropes and lifts to the yards
Ship making a spritsail yard
saw blackfish

Wednesday
March
28th
1837 Squally with torrents
of rain variously employed
saw 1 ship So as

Thursday
March
29th
1837 Rigged a new spritsail
yard across the bows fitted
lifts portrell and foot roof
ropes &c so on this
Lat 5:00 S

Friday
March
30th Fresh Trades and heavy fitted
new runners to the topsail
halyards rose new topmast
backstay halyards latter
part squally with showers
of rain So as

Saturday
March 31st
1837 Spliced in new brace pendants
rose new topsail and main
braces topsail stowlines
reef tackles and buntlines
five braces & at 7 A. M.
tacked North and I hope
for the last time
squally with frequent showers
of rain
