Heavy gales from N.E.
to S.W. attended with
torrents of rain sharp
lightning and thunder
running under at close reefed
fore and main top sails and
jibsails Course E.S.E. by compass
the old ship makes good
weather of it she is light as
a cup So as

of April

Hard gales throughout running
under double reefed top sails
Course E by N first part
raining latter part clear
