

## Ship Isaac Howland

Thursday  
The last  
day of May  
Wind from the North  
we shall put to sea  
as soon as the wind  
favours us mending  
the boat

Friday  
June 1st  
1838  
A clear North not  
much work going on

Saturday  
June 2nd  
1838  
Drooped up our  
main top gallant  
mast and set up the  
rigging wind at north  
blow south wind blow

Sunday  
3rd day  
of June  
Wind at south and clear  
at 8 it all weighed anchor  
and sailed from this  
miserable place at noon  
off the Island of Iurruacai  
beached about boats and  
towed out

## Cruising on Oriti

Monday  
the 4th  
at 4 P.M. took 8 wind from the  
the 4th. We hoisted the boats and  
day of June away we sailed and cleared  
Iurruacai bore East 2 dist 4  
miles the remainder part of  
the day steering from N.W. to N.E.  
to W. we shot the guns  
and stopped them behind the  
some hours

Lat by Cos 35° 33'

Tuesday  
June 5th  
1838  
Baffling winds and rainings  
steering from S.E. to N.W.  
fired the whaling craft to  
the boats

Wednesday  
June 6th  
1838  
Wind at all points of the  
compass shifted the main  
topsail and main top gallant  
sails double reefed the main  
topsail and hauled the main  
course  
Lat 34° 35'
