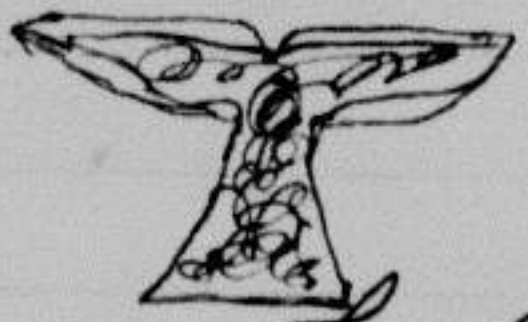


Ship Isaac Howland

Wednesday
Sept 5th
1838 Steady winds from the
W & W and rising
clouds steering S.W. by W
Lat by Obs 10° 24'

Thursday
Sept 6th
1838 Wind at 4 M squally with
rain at 7 A.M. saw
A school of large sperm
whales under the ship
jib boom down 3 boats and
gave chase one large bull
in sight at 10 3 miles to wind-
ward gave them up and came on
board

Long 42° 50' West

Haw whales

Friday
Sept 7th
1838 Moderate gales and
cloudy the wind
hauled round gradually
to the E & E shifted
studding sails
Lat by Obs 13° 32'

In the L. E. Trades.

Saturday
Sept 8th
1838 Wind at East
and the weather
pleasant spoke a
detached brig from Rio
bound to New Orleans
bought her and bought
tobacco and cigars

Lat 14° 45' S
Long 45° 40' West

Sunday
Sept 9th
1838 Pleasant trades and
pleasant weather
masts and topgallant
studding sails set to
catch the favouring breeze
Course S.W. by E on half
gave a sail standing to the
Southward there appears
some hope of seeing America
again and those we love best
