Sept. 16th 1838 Pleasant gales from S E and cloudy with lightning the ship's Paris & Waverley in sight of us armed with the latter P.M. broke the main royal yard in the slings made another and crossed it

Monday

Sept. 17th 1838 Moderate S E winds and passing clouds painted ship outside course S W all drawing sail set

Lat by D.R. 25° 26' S

Long 58° 20' W

Tuesday

Sept. 18th Wind and weather continues the same painted the combings water ways and rails A black coal colour the W in sight

Lat by D.R. 26° 26'

Long by Watch 59° 58' W

Wednesday Sept. 19th 1838 First part ~~moderate~~ S E winds and clear clearing S W by Compass at midday the wind at S W and squally with showers of rain drenched the rigging and took in studding sails stowed the spare harpoons and lances and coal hard them

Thursday Sept. 20th 1838 Wind at N E S W and S W with light showers of rain stowing S W watches at work on various necessary jobs

Lat by D.R. 29° 16' S

Friday

20th of Sept. Light S E winds and clear set the studding sails low and lifted the W in sight of us

Lat 29° 34' North

Long 63° 20' West
