Wednesday October 3^d 1848

Is ushered in with beautiful weather and
pleasant gales from the NW steering south
set how land aloft our course is N by W
and all hands are in high spirits. Who
would not be in good spirits that have been
absent from home 19 months and eloquence
as we might say of the society of
civilized beings for the half breeds on the
Spanish coast are not much wiser of our
savages in the wilderness and I am
certain they are not ~~in~~ hospitality
at 6 AM made Montook Point (East end
of Long Island) bearing N W dist by Est.
25 miles at 9 took a vineyard pilot and
bore up for Cutlerhook crossed the fore
noon royal guard sent the ship sail poles
aloft and set all abounding suit to the
best advantage at Meridian the block Island
bore N W 15 miles.

we govern your own passions keep down anger be not
hasty neither in word deed or action keep cool and
put on it manly deportment and a commanding
countenance and if you wish to study the human
nature study the Bible there you will find what pertains
to it and if you wish to take a cursory view of it
make use of what art you possess and penetrate the
mind of those inoffensive beings I made mention of
and there you will see as in a glass clearly if you
conform yourself to it you will in time see face to face
