

Remarks On Board Bark Subella Bount.

Saturday July 31st Day
First part light breeze & pleasant weather from the Northward
Ship by the wind under all sail heading to Westward. Middle
part the same. Ship under short sail. Latter part calm
Spoke the Princess Bealmy.

Lat 44.17 N. Long 28.16 West

Sunday July August the 1st Day
First part calm. Middle part the same. Latter part light
breeze & pleasant from SW. kept off to the Northward. Spoke
the ship Orangle of St. John's bound to Boston. with
thick fog. No Obs. this day

Monday August the 2d Day
First part light breeze & thick fog from SW. Steaming to the
Northward under all sail. Middle part the wind changed
to the Northward. Ship under short sail. Latter part
wind the same with thick fog. No Obs. this day

Tuesday August the 3d Day
First part fresh breeze from the Northward with thick fog.
Steaming different course. Saw several sail. Middle &
Latter part strong gale. Ship by the wind heading to the
Westward under short sail.

Lat 45.05 N. Long 29.08 West

Wednesday August the 4th Day
First part strong gale from the Northward. Ship heading
to the Westward by the wind under double reefed top sails
Middle & Latter part strong gale. At 7 A.M. set whole
top sails & kept off SW by compass. with thick fog.
Ship under all sail.

Lat 43.53 N. Long 29.52 West

Toward The Western Islands Or Azores August 1852

Thursday August the 5th Day
First part strong gale with much fog from the Northward. Ship
under all sail. Course SW by compass. Middle & Latter part
fresh breeze & clear. Course the same. No wind this day.
Lat 41.26 N. Long 30.30 West

Friday August the 6th Day
First part fresh breeze from N.E. Course SW & S. Middle part ship
on different tack heading by the wind. Latter part made all sail
to the SW. wind to N.E. with a heavy swell. At 7 A.M. saw
the Island of Corvo one of the Azores. bearing west & S. distant
35 miles by estimation.

Lat 39.52. Long 30.38 West

Saturday August 7th Day
First part light breeze from NE & pleasant. Ship heading to the
SW. Corvo & Flores both in sight. Saw a number of sail. Middle
part heading by the wind on different tack under short sail.
Latter part fresh breeze from the Northward Steaming to the SE.
Lat 38.44 N. Long 29.30 West

Sunday August 8th Day
First part fresh gale from SE. Ship under double reefed top sails
steaming to the Northward. Middle part by the wind on different
tack under short sail. At 7 A.M. saw the Island of Faial
bearing SE Central point. Spoke the James Andrews 14 months
out 550 Bbls sperm oil. Saw several other ships.

Monday August 9th Day
First part fresh gale from the Northward. Ship by the wind on
different tack heading off & on shore. Middle part the same
Latter part made all sail & stood in for the town or principal
port of Faial. with light breeze from the Eastward. the
town in sight with a number of ships at anchor & lying off
and on. No wind this day
