

Remarks On Board Bark Isabella From The Line.

Wednesday Sept the 22^d Day
First part light breeze & pleasant from the eastward. Ship heading by the wind. At 1 P.M. kept off S.W. by S. Middle & last part steering the same. At 10 P.M. saw one sperm whale laved two boats & struck him. No oils with the boat's part & the whale spouting blood
Lat 16.29 South. Long 34.46 West

Thursday Sept the 23^d Day
First part fine pleasant weather. At 9 A.M. took the above mentioned whale alongside. At 2 P.M. hauled on & commenced cutting. At 6 P.M. finished cutting the body. Middle part lying by the board & clearing up the deck. Latter part took in the head & commenced boiling.
Lat 16.30 S. Long 35.02 West

Friday Sept the 24th Day
First part gentle breeze & pleasant weather. Wind E.S.E. Ship heading S. by the wind. Employed boiling. One sail in night. Middle part under short sail. Latter part made sail & headed on different tack. Employed boiling.
Lat 17.09 South. Long 35.01 West

Saturday Sept the 25th Day
First part light breeze & pleasant. Ship heading on different tack employed boiling. Middle part heading to the southward under short sail. Latter made sail to the North finished boiling.
Lat 17.21 S. Long 35.58 West

Sunday Sept the 26th Day
First part gentle breeze & pleasant from the eastward. Ship heading to the Northward. At day down shortened sail for the night. Middle & last part heading to the Southward. At day light made all sail. passed a buoy standing to the Northward.
Lat 17.30 South. Long 36.21 West

Bound To The Southward Toward Falkland Islands Sept 1852

Monday Sept 27th Day
First part gentle breeze & fine weather from the eastward. Ship under all sail heading S.W. by E. by compass. At day down took in sail. Middle & last part heading to the Northward under double reefed top sails. fresh breeze from the eastward. broke out the main hatch to stow down oil.
Lat 16.53 South

Tuesday Sept the 28th Day
First part fresh breeze from the eastward. Ship heading by the wind to the Northward under double reefed top sails. Employed steaming down oil. Middle & last part standing to the Northward spoke Bark Silas Richards of the Bedford. no oil on board
Lat 16.31 S. Long 36.10 West

Wednesday Sept the 29th Day
First part gentle breeze & pleasant weather. Ship under all sail heading to the Southward. the Silas Richards in company. Middle part heading the same. Latter part heading to the Northward under all sail. wind fresh from E.N.E.
Lat 17.21 South. Long 35.53 West

Thursday Sept the 30th Day
First part light breeze & pleasant. wind E.N.E. Ship heading by the wind to the S.E. Middle & last part heading to the Northward. wind & weather much the same. one sail in night
Lat 16.38 South Long 36.02 West

Friday Oct the 1st Day
First part light breeze & pleasant. wind E.N.E. Ship under all sail heading to the Southward. Middle part under short sail. Latter part made all sail to the Southward. wind as above. one sail in night
Lat 17.27 South. Long 35.44 West
