Wednesday November the 10th Day
First part pleasant weather & fresh breezes from S.W. Steaming E.N.E.
At sun down took in sail. Middle part strong gales. Ship
under short sail. Latter part more moderate. At whole top sails
Ship heading on different tacks

Lat. 46.29 South. Long 56.33 W

Thursday November the 11th Day
First part strong gales from the westward. Ship heading to
the Northward under short sail. Spoke the Sappho
Middle & last part much the same as first part

Lat 46.33 S. Long 56.12 West

Friday November the 12th Day
First part strong gales & rugged weather. Wind to the Westward
Ship heading to the Northward under double reefed top sails
the Sappho in sight. Middle part as first. Latter
part more moderate. Ship heading to the Northward

Lat 47.33 S. Long 56.33 West

Saturday November the 13th
First part fresh gales & rugged weather. Wind to Westward
Ship under double reefed top sails heading to the Northward
At sun down close reefed the top sails. Middle & last
part heading by the wind on different tacks. the Sappho
in company

Lat 47.46 South. Long 57.11 West

Sunday November the 14th Day
First part wind strong from the westward & rugged weather
Ship by the wind to the Northward under double reefed top
sails. Spoke Dutch Bark Antares of Hamburg bound to
San Francisco. This day picked up a box of bar soap. Mached
Mr. Steel. Liverpool. Middle & last part light breezes from the
Westward. Ship heading to the S.W.

of Falkland Islands And Toward Cape Horn November 1832

Monday November the 15th Day
First part calm. the Sappho in sight. At 7 P.M. one
of the men by the name of Peter, a native of Easter Island
died of Consumption. Buried his remains at 8 P.M.
Middle part took a light breeze from S.W. Course W.S.W. by compass
Ship under all sail. Latter part fresh gales. Double reefed the top
sails. ends with strong gales. Course as above

Lat 47.49 South

Tuesday November the 16th Day
First part strong gales from the westward. Ship under double
reefed top sails heading to the Southward. At 6 P.M. close
reefed the main top sail & took in the fore top sail
blowing heavy from the Southward. Middle & last part
strong gales from the Westward. Ship under short sail heading
to the Southward.

Lat 48.28 South. Long 59.46 W

Wednesday November the 17th Day
First part strong gales from the Westward. Ship under
short sail heading to the Southward. Middle part the
same. Latter part wind S.W. & more moderate. Made all
sail to the Westward. ends with fine weather

Lat 49.02 S. Long 60.48 West

Thursday November the 18th Day
First part fresh gales from S.W. Ship heading by the wind
W.S.W. Middle part heading S.W. the wind as above. Latter part
fresh breezes from S.W. Ship heading S.S.E.

Lat 50.18 S. Long 62.40 West

Friday November the 19th Day
First part fresh breezes from S.W. Ship by the wind heading Southward
at 6 P.M. wore ship to the S.W. Middle part light breezes from
the Northward. Course S.S.W. Latter part fresh from S.W. Course South
S.E.

Lat 51.44 S. Long 63.13 West
