

Remarks While Cruising In

Friday June the 24th Day

First part fine pleasant weather. Saw a number of whales but very small lowered and chased four hours to no effect. Middle and last part fine weather. Sent two boats in shore to look for whales. Saw none. returned to the ship and kept off for the western part of the bay. at 11^{1/2} A.M. saw whales lowered and struck one. sent with the boats fast to the whale and fresh breezes from the eastward

Saturday June the 25th

First part strong easterly winds. took the whale to the ship at 4 P.M. and hooked on to cut. finished at 10 P.M. Middle and last part calm and light baffling winds. Saw whales. at 7 P.M. lowered and struck one. took him to the ship and hooked on to cut at 12. M.

Sunday June the 26th

First part fine weather. Employed cutting the whale finished at 3 P.M. and commenced to boil. Middle part strong breezes from the westward and rugged. Latter part more moderate ship on different tacks cruising about in the bay employed boiling. Several ships in sight

Monday June the 27th

First part light air from S.W. with thick fog. Ship by the wind on different tacks employed boiling. Middle part fresh breezes from the eastward with thick fog. Ship heading to the southward employed boiling. Latter part light baffling winds and clear. Saw no whales.

Tuesday June the 28th

First part light baffling winds and fine weather. Employed boiling. Saw no whales. Middle and last part strong breezes from the eastward and rugged. Ship under short sail employed boiling. Several ships in sight

The Ochoish Sea June and July 1833

Wednesday June the 29th

First part strong breezes from the eastward and rugged finished boiling. Saw no whales. Saw a number of ships. Middle and last part fresh breezes. Ship heading on different tacks under easy sail employed steering down oil

Thursday June the 30th

First part light baffling winds and calm employed steering down oil. finished at 6 P.M. Saw no whales. Middle part light air from the eastward. Latter part strong breezes with rain. Ship by the wind under easy sail heading on different tacks. a number of ships in sight

Friday July the 1st Day

First part strong gales from the eastward. Ship under easy sail heading to the southward. a number of ships in sight. Middle and last part baffling winds calm and rainy weather. Saw no whales

Saturday July the 2nd Day

First part light baffling winds and calm with rain. Several ships in sight. Middle and last part fine weather with light breezes from the westward. Ship cruising about the bay. Saw no whales. spoke the Commodore of Esbury, 6 whales this season

Sunday July the 3rd Day

First part fine weather with light breezes from S.E. Saw a number of ships but no whales. Middle and last part baffling winds and calm at 6 P.M. sent the boats in to the island. Saw none. End with fine weather.

Monday July the 4th

First part light air from S.E. and fine weather. Several ships in sight but no whales. spoke the Astor, Williams of Newington. Middle and last part light baffling winds. Stead over on the eastern shore. Saw a number of ships at anchor. Some of them boiling. Saw no whales.
