

Bank Isabella Cruising In.

Tuesday July the 5th

First part light baffling winds and calm weather. Ship Cruising about the bay. Saw three whales. lowered to no effect. 10 ships in sight some of them boiling. Middle and last part baffling winds and fine weather. Saw several whales but very wild. lowered and chased to no effect. Many ships in sight all whaling but none caught any.

Wednesday July the 6th

First part calm. At 1 P.M. struck a whale. At 2 P.M. took the whale to the ship and hooked on to cut. Middle part strong breezes from the N.E. Latter part calm. Employed boiling.

Thursday July the 7th

First part baffling winds and calm weather. Employed boiling. Spoke the Marenge with eight whales this season. Middle and last part calm. Employed boiling. Saw no whales. finished boiling.

Friday July the 8th

First part light breezes from S.E. Ship in different tracks Cruising about the bay. Saw a few whales all on the move. lowered twice without success. Spoke the Fabius with three whales this season. Middle and last part baffling winds and calm weather. Stood to the westward. Saw no whales but many ships.

Saturday July the 9th

First part strong breezes from S.E. Ship heading to the S.W. Many ships in sight but no whales. Spoke the Bank Rajah with 6 whales. Also the Congress with nothing this season. Middle and last part light breezes from the Southward. Ship heading to Eastward. Saw one small whale. lowered to no effect.

Sunday July the 10th

First part fresh breezes from S.W. Saw several wild whales. lowered and chased 4 hours without success. Middle and last part light air from the Eastward with some rain. Saw whales. lowered several times to no effect. Spoke the Marenge.

The Chotsk Sea July 18, 93

Monday July the 11th

First part light air and calm weather. At 2 P.M. stood in shore in 30 fathoms of water and anchored in company with the Marenge. Hunted with her and sent two boats from each ship along shore in search of whales. Saw none. Middle and last part fine weather the boats off looking for whales. Saw a few but very wild. Ends with fresh easterly winds and squalls.

Tuesday July the 12th

First part fresh breezes from the Eastward and rugged. Three boats in shore looking for whales. Boats returned to the ship at 6 P.M. having seen a few wild whales. Middle and last part fresh breezes. Sent the boats in at 5 A.M. ends with fresh breezes. Ship at anchor.

Wednesday July the 13th

First part fresh gales from the Eastward with rain. the boats off. returned at 4 P.M. having as usual seen a few wild whales. Middle and last part strong breezes. At 2 A.M. sent two boats in shore to look for whales. ends with strong gales and rain.

Thursday July the 14th

First part fresh gales from N.E. two boats in shore looking for whales. At 1 P.M. took the anchor and got underway. the boats returned at dusk having seen many whales but too rugged to strike any of them. Was forced to land. At 8 P.M. came to anchor again. At day light went in again with the boats in company with the Marenge boats. Saw a few whales but very wild. ends with fine weather.

Friday July the 15th

First part fine weather. the boats in shore in company with the Marenge boats. One of her boats struck a whale. took the whale to that ship and cut him in. Middle part fine weather. Three of the boats stopped in shore to be ready for an early start. Latter part the boats in shore cruising. One of the Marenge's boats struck and anchored another whale.
