

Bank. Isabella Crossing In

Wednesday July the 27th

First part light breezes from the Southwest with fog. Ship heading by the wind to the Southwest. Saw no whales. Middle and last part baffling winds and calm weather with fog. Saw several whales. lowered to no effect. Saw two ships cutting. Ends clear and fine weather

Thursday July the 28th

First part light airs from the Southwest with some fog. Saw one whale. lowered to no effect. Middle and last part calm and foggy weather. Several ships in sight but no whales. ends with fog

Friday July the 29th

First part light airs from the Southwest with thick fog. At 6 P.M. the fog lifted a up. Several ships in sight but no whales. Middle part foggy. latter part some fog. Saw a number of whales. lowered to no effect. ends with rain wind light from the Southwest

Saturday July the 30th

First part fresh breezes from the Southwest with much rain. Several ships in sight and no whales. Middle part strong breezes with rain latter part calm foggy and rainy. Spoke the Brighton with one whale this season

Sunday July the 31st

First part baffling winds calm and rainy weather. Saw three whales going fast. did not lower. spoke the Betsey Williams of Stonington 15 whales this season. Middle and last part rain and fog. Saw no whales. ends with strong gales

Monday August the 1st Day

First part light baffling winds. calm foggy rainy fresh breezes from all points of the compass. And all kinds of weather imaginable. Several ships in sight. Middle and last part much the same as first part

The Ochotsk Sea July and August 1853

Tuesday August the 2^d Day

First part light baffling winds calm and rainy weather. Middle and last part light breezes from the Southwest with fog occasionally. Saw some grey backs whales. No called by whalman. No whales of the right kind to be seen

Wednesday August the 3^d Day

First part light baffling baffling winds and calm with fog. Several ships in sight and no whales. Middle and last part light breezes from the Southwest with some rain and fog. At 11 A.M. Saw whales lowered and struck one ends with fine weather and the boats fast to a whale



Thursday August the 4th

First part fine weather at 3 P.M. took the whale to the ship. hooked on and commenced cutting. finished at 9 P.M. Middle and last part fine weather at 7 A.M. commenced boiling. Saw several whales lowered and chased to no effect

Friday August the 5th

First part light breezes from the Southwest and fine weather employed boiling. Saw a number of whales. lowered and chased to no effect. Many ships and boats in sight all whaling. Middle and last part calm and fine weather. Saw no whales

Saturday August the 6th

First part light baffling winds and calm weather with some fog. Saw a few whales but all of them on the move. lowered to no effect. Several ships in sight. Middle and last part calm and foggy. employed boiling

Sunday August the 7th

First part fine weather. Saw several whales. lowered and struck two down from one and saved the other. took the whale to the ship. hooked on and commenced cutting. Middle part fresh breezes from the Southwest employed cutting the whale. finished cutting at 1 A.M. latter part foggy weather. Saw several whales. lowered to no effect
