Thursday June 27th light air from E.S.E. Brig working & trying to get out of the heavy ice weather Fogg. Caught two Seals at 12 P.M. Brig clear of the ice Steered S. twenty miles Logged about 4 hours

Friday June 28th fresh breeze from the E Steering S.W. by V. heavy weather & have seen no ice

Saturday June 29th moderate breeze from the E Steering S.W. Saw finbacks cloudy weather

Sunday June 30th light breeze from the E with foggy weather Steering S.W. Saw plenty of Finbacks Sea about 60. Log about 34.30 W

Monday July 1st light breeze from the E Steering S.W. Foggy weather

Tuesday July 2nd fresh breeze from E to S Steering from S.W. by S. at 8 P.M. Clear weather Saw several ice bergs to the Westward were ship heading S.E. under short sea

Lat 60.11 N Long 60.29 W

Wednesday July 3rd light breeze from the W. Brig by the wind on different tacks ice bergs in sight to Westward

Lat 60.11 N Long 60.44 W

Thursday July 4th first part light air & later fresh breeze from the S.W. Brig Steering different courses to the Eastward working out of a large bite of ice plenty of ice. Bergs and ice in sight at 1 P.M. Sailed to be out of the above bite Steering S.W. pack Bering W.

Friday July 5th moderate breeze from the S. with Fog Steering different courses along the Pack of ice and lying aback at times our Lat I should guess was about 58.45.

Saturday July 6th moderate breeze from the S.W. Brig by the wind in the Eastern tack gave up heaving to the South of the ice shall by the V. passage again no ice in sight this afternoon Lat 58.46 N Long 68.38 W

Sunday July 7th moderate breeze from the S. Steering S.W. Saw ice Bergs

Lat 59.14 N Long 68.40 W

Monday July 8th moderate breeze from the S.W. Brig by the wind on different tacks

Lat 60.55 N Long 68.14 W

Tuesday July 9th light breeze from the N with clear weather Brig by the wind on different tacks
