Friday Sept 6th

fresh breeze from the S with fog and rain Brig off yellow bluff two vessels in sight saw spent supposed it was a Bombard

Saturday Sept 7th

fresh breeze from the S.W. with rain squalls Steaming different courses at 2 P.M. saw Cape Palliser bearing S.W. distant 10 miles

Sunday Sept 8th

moderate breeze from the S.W. with clear weather Brig by the windpoint tactics Cape Palliser in sight to the N

Monday Sept 9th

moderate breeze from the S.W. with squally weather at 2 P.M. Depot Island bearing S.W. 10 miles distant

Tuesday Sept 10th

fresh breeze from the S.W. Brig by the wind on different tacks and going back land in sight

Wednesday Sept 11th

Strong breeze from S.E. to S.W. with snow vessel by the wind on different tacks at 2 P.M. saw the Abbie Bradford and Abbott Lawrence Steaming N.

Thursday Sept 12th

fresh breeze from the S.E. at 3 P.M. Anchored at Marble Island in the outer Harbor in company with the Abbott Lawrence and Abbie Bradford the Chowner Bothen of New York is in the inner Harbor

Friday Sept 13th

fresh breeze from the S.W. the Brig in tow the Inner Harbor Anchored in 18 fathoms of water

Saturday Sept 14th Light breeze from the westward with pleasant weather towed the Abbott Lawrence in the Inner Harbor the Abbie Bradford did not get under way and went out to cruise

Sunday Sept 15th

Strong breeze from the S with rain the Abbie Bradford Anchored in the outer Harbor this morning we dropped our second Anchor

Monday Sept 16th

fresh breeze from S.W. to V.W. with rainy weather

Tuesday Sept 17th

fresh breeze from the S.W. with rainy weather employed pumping out Salt water getting ready for winter
