

Remarks on Board Brig Isabella

Sunday May 11th Strong breeze from the N.W. Sailed ice about one hour saw arrival of natives bringing Deer meat and some fish

Monday May 12th Strong breeze from the N.W. One Watch from each vessel went large for the ice in the outer Harbor and found a French whaler around a large floe of ice in it off this strong breeze will blow it too sea the boat has been saying off our natives to day for about 3000 lbs of meat that they have brought us this winter

Tuesday May 13th Fresh breeze from N.W. to N.E. employed Sailing Trenches

Wednesday May 14th Strong breeze from the S.W. with Snow Employed Sailing ice at 3 P.M. Stopped Sailing could not get the ice out

Thursday May 15th moderate breeze from the N.E. to N.W. Sailed a little ice employed pushing out ice and breaking thin ice

Friday May 16th Strong breeze from the N. with Snow Sailed ice watch about 12 hours

Saturday May 17th Strong breeze from the N.W. employed part of the day Sailing out shore ice

Sunday May 18th Fresh breeze from the N. Some of the Harbor ice went out this fore noon Started Sailing at 4 P.M.

Monday May 19th Strong breeze from the N.W. Sailed ice all night Trenching through day

Tuesday May 20th Light airs from the N.E. called off the watch at 3.00 A.M. to shave the ice out of the passage that connects the outer and inner Harbor have too work Tide work got about one half of it out

Wednesday May 21st Light breeze from the S.W. employed clearing the passage at 2 P.M. Started to Sailing out the inner Harbor

Thursday May 22nd Blowing a gale from the N.W. employed 4 M Sailed ice Sailed part of the afternoon

Friday May 23rd Strong breeze from the N.W. Finished Sailing out the vessels waiting fore High Water to ball the vessels out
