Monday June 16th

moderate breeze from N.E. to S.E. with foggy weather. Took up fore and three sails in sight the Abbie Boiling

Tuesday June 17th

fresh breeze from the S.E. with fog and rain off Cape Gollipet

Wednesday June 18th

Strong breeze from S.E. to N.W. with rain and foggy weather vessel heading to the N.E. at 4 P.M. saw the ice off Depot Island hauled the fore and sail back

Thursday June 19th

moderate breeze from the N.W. with clear weather made the ice about 20 miles N.E. of Chesterfield field the ice to the S.W. down to the Chesterfield inlet three sails in sight off the above in let

Friday June 20th

light breeze from the W. with calm weather and three sails. Damned the Abbie Bradford and Abbott Lawrence went to get to the S. ice will not let us

Saturday June 21st

light breeze from W to S.W. steering towards Marble Island at 12 m. close to the A. Bradford and A. Lawrence went to the island to get water latter Isabella heading to the Cape Gollipet and Marble Island in sight

Sunday June 22nd

light air from N.W. to S.E. with clear weather steering to the N.W. in company with the latter land in sight of Chesterfield saw a vessel Boiling a stern Supper there is melting ice

Monday June 23rd

light breeze from the N.E. with Snowy Gulls Whale Point in sight to the S.W. there is about 6 miles of water from ice to shore saw about 20 natives on the above point Spike the Abbie Bradford caught a 40 lb. Whale Sunday off the S. end of Marble Island

Tuesday June 24th

moderate breeze from the N.W. with Bigg by the wind on different tracks to the N.W. and 3 sails in sight and the land about 20 miles to the S. of Depot Island

Wednesday June 25th

moderate breeze from the S.E. in the morning Depot Island in sight two sails latter Bigg working to the S. in company with A. Bradford rainy weather

Thursday June 26th

Strong breeze from the S.E. with rainy weather at 8 am. of W. Karsford and middle and latter vessel by the wind heading S. in company with the A. Bradford Bonnet for the S. shore saw the Abbie saw the Chevre latter

Friday June 27th

light air from the S.E. with calm weather vessel independent tracks in company with the A. Bradford not much ice around Cape Kendall being N.W. distance 14 miles

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
