

Remarks on board Brig, Isabella

Monday July 7th

Strong breeze from the S. vessel by the wind on distant tacks the A. Lawrence went out of site this forenoon headed to the N. the A. Bradford is in site James Mc Gurney is off Duty with the Survey

Tuesday July 8th

Strong breeze from the S. with rain W. shore in site and spoke the A. Bradford the Capt went on board a few minutes came on board kept off N.W. at 10.30 AM the A. Bradford saw a Whale Sen lost site of him saw the same Whale from the Isabella sword at 10.30 AM came on board at 2.30 PM no success blowing strong with rain at 10.30 PM Breeze under full sail Bradford and the land in site about 4 miles off bearing S.

Wednesday July 9th

Strong breeze from the S. with rain at 11 AM Anchored off the N. end of the Bay about 10 miles S. of Maurice point the A. Bradford Anchored about 7 miles S. of us

Thursday July 10th

Strong breeze from the S. with thick weather Capt Mr. Rangel went on shore with a Boat's Crew Native shot a Deer Came off at 6 P.M. at 8 P.M. saw Whale turn but did not see him again.

Friday July 11th

moderate breeze from the S. with rainy weather took our Anchor at 8 AM made sail spoke the A. Bradford at 12. saw keep off N.W. by N.

Saturday July 12th

light air from the S. with calm weather Breeze by the wind to the N.W. A. Bradford in site Saw several Seal

Sunday July 13th

light air from the S. with calm weather Cape Fullerton in site and three Seals

Monday July 14th

light air from the S. with fog Breeze by the wind on distant tacks saw Cape Fullerton about one mile off and saw several ice

Tuesday July 15th

light air from the S. with fog Cape Fullerton and the A. Lawrence in site

Wednesday July 16th

light air from the S.W. to S. clear weather most of the day steering from S.E. by S. to S.S.E. at 4.30 PM Cape Kendall bearing S.E. about 15 miles distant Port Fire light gallant back stay stranded foot in another strand saw a Seal in Mirage to the N

Thursday July 17th

commences with moderate breeze from the S.W. saw the land the S. side of the Bay at 9.30 AM saw several Whales heard four Boats the S.B. and B.B. Partner killed the S.B. Whale at 2.30 PM the B.B. Whale was killed about 3.30 PM the Capt went on board and worked the Brigs up to windward after the B.B. Whale that run on shore so suggest the B.B. had to lose him keep the vessel off shore the S.B. Whale and saw the B. pulling fore the vessel Whale had drifted on shore Anchored the vessel in 20 fathoms of water saw the S.B. Whale on the shore in kept too get them off when it moderate
