

Remarks on Board Brig Isabella

Friday July 18th

light breeze from the S.W. to W. at 9.00 A.M. 4 Boats left the vessel the first officer and the 4. officer to get the S.B. Whale but soon came on Board went on shore at high water and succeeded in getting the Whale to the vessel and cut him in the second and third officers went to get the B.B. Whale the second officer came on Board about 5.00 P.M. leaving the third officer with the Whale sent the 2. officer back to the Whale again to tell the 3. officer to come on board at 12. P.M. they are not on Board the vessel is Anchored in 20 fathoms of water

Saturday July 19th

light air from the Westward 2nd and third came off at 1.00 A.M. at 6.00 A.M. too the Anchor made Sail started to the S. along the land employed Boiling 2nd mate Boiling saw Line had lost the Line on the Whale at 7.00 P.M. Anchored in 11 fathoms of water Capt 2nd officer 6 men went to the above Whale to try to save some of him at 10.00 P.M. sent another Boat to help tow off the Blubber at 2.00 A.M. took our Anchor and started to the two Boats took them along side Anchored the vessel had saved the Whales Head and some of the Blubber

Sunday July 20th

commences with a moderate breeze from the Eastward employed Boiling and hoisted in the above Blubber vessel Anchored in 14 fathoms of water saw the Whales Carcass floating off shore at 6.00 P.M. sent the 2nd mate in after the tools that were left there yesterday came off at 11.00 P.M.

Monday July 21st

fresh breeze from the S.W. A.M. Finerhill Boiling and 3 towing down 75. Bbls took the Anchor made Sail Brig by the wind on different tacks off and the land

Tuesday July 22nd

moderate breeze from the W. to W. with pleasant weather Brig by the wind and steering along the land from Monico Point to the S.W. end of Southampton at 2. headed off Shore Bunch of those Welcom scraped the two last heads of Bone

Wednesday July 23rd

commences with light air from the S.W. by the wind on different tacks latter fresh breeze from the S.W. steering N.W. by N. passed Cape Kendall about 10 miles off

Thursday July 24th

moderate breeze from the S.W. to S.W. and S. again Brig off Whale Point Gammed the A. Bradford had seen nothing since we saw him one week ago carried Capt Sinclair over to the Deck of the A. J. Ross A. Lawrence in situ

Friday July 25th

light breeze from the S.W. Brig by the wind on different tacks 2 P.M. vessel between Cape Pallington and Kendall three sails in sight think me is a new comer foggy and rainy weather the above new sail proved to be a old neighbor 8 other

Saturday July 26th Moderate breeze from the S. with the vessel by the wind on different tacks Cape Kendall in situ and three sails Capt Fisher of the A. Bradford came on Board
