

Shipper Strait Bound To

Sunday Sept 20
Commenced with light breeze from the NNE. All
Drawing sail Course S one watch employed variously
Middle & latter part match the same latter part light
Breezes and calm At 7 AM saw a large sperm
Whale 2 miles off the largest quarter hauled on
the wind All sail the whale broad water 3 points
off the weather and starboard tacks in board 4 miles
off toward the boats barbed waist and bow gear for
the whale the waist boat got close to the whale
Gale him about ten miles to the windward of
the shipper so Enos boat off

Monday Sept 21 Commenced with light breezes from
the NNE Course S All Drawing sail At 1 PM
Starboard boat came on board At 2 PM the waist
and bow boats came on board squared at way
Middle and latter part pleasant and light
Breezes All hands employed At 9 AM
Saw a shipper a stern heading S by W

Tuesday Sept 22 Commenced with light breezes
and pleasant weather All sail Course S by W
Wind W All hands employed variously At
sunset the above ship about 3 miles at stern
Middle and latter part match the same so Enos

Wednesday Sept 23 Began with light breezes and
pleasant weather Course S S W wind W All sail
All hands employed sitting up for and main rig on
sitting up cutting gunwales See the above shipper
in sight off the lee bow middle and latter part
light breezes and variable latter part cloudy three
sails in sight one of the boys off duty Deck
the cook is on duty

Thursday Sept 24 Commenced with light breezes
and variable course S by W W All sail for
sunset and main rig galore stand on side part of
the time All hands employed middle and latter part
the same latter part showery saw two ships
heading S W to Enos

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Friday Sept 25 the 1846
Began with light breezes and variable cloudy him
showery All sail Course S by W W wind from the
NNE and S E wind All hands employed variously
middle and latter part pleasant breezes from the
E W E and cloudy so Enos

Longitude by Co 22-52 W

Saturday Sept 26 Began with pleasant
breezes from the E W E All sail Course S by W W
and cloudy one watch employed making gunwales
middle and latter part breezes and cloudy At 1 PM
Bent for a mizon royals so Enos

Sunday Sept 27 Commenced with pleasant and trades
and cloudy Course S by W W W All sail one watch employed
Boy Williams well on duty middle and latter part the same

Monday Sept 28 Still twenty four hours began with
fine pleasant breezes from the NNE Course S by W W W All sail
Boy Williams on duty well middle and latter part the same

Tuesday Sept 29 Fine pleasant weather from the NNE
Course S by W W W All sail one watch employed middle
and latter part gentle breezes from the NNE by W and cloudy

Latitude by ob 18-57 N
Longitude by Co 22-48 W

Wednesday Sept 30 Pleasant and trades and cloudy Course
S by W W W All sail one watch employed middle cloudy
sun squally heavy rigging fly jib latter part squally heavy rain
At daylight saw the ice of Sable showing S W without
15 miles off At 8 AM saw a shipper S S W squally strong
Breezes and variable At 10 set 5 g sails bands

Thursday October 1 Began with fresh gales and rain
squally from the E and from the S E by the wind
Starboard tacks on board At 5:30 AM Barometer bearing
& about twenty miles Dist At 6 PM saw a shipper S S W
Middle part rain squally and light breezes heading NNE
At 2:30 AM were ship At 4 AM were to the south
All sail and light breezes At 8 AM toward the boats
for blackfish did not get came on board At 11 AM
employed knocking out the shipper to find old board
