

Shipping Israel off the Cape Verde Islands

Friday, Oct 2, 1846

Begint with a light breeze and calm till about one
 o'clock on deck employed looking out for the breed
 At sunset the ill of May, the West point bearing S 12 W
 24 miles abt the E point of St. Jago bearing S 75 E about
 25 abt Stago bearing S 72 W. S. E. middle and latter
 Port Calne and the light air so ends during between
 the ill of May and St. Jago

Saturday Oct 3 Commenced with a light Air and
Calms heading S W fair wind what there is of it
One watch employed sitting up for and about
stays the rest of the P M the S S point of the ill of
the days being W S W about 8 miles Dist milled
Port of heavy rain begins of and on at
at 10 o'clock Oct 4th 1 Cape Dexter and 2 Boats
Crew went on shore two Portuguese Manuel and
Peter left Cadangers and John Crowl one of the
Shippers crew sick latter part laying of and on

Banana Oct 4 Begins with moderate breezes
and passing rain squalls The Captain on shore
At 2 PM The Starboard boat came on board
With oranges 2 goats &c At six PM The capst
Came on board in the bow boat with Bananas
&c Much salt sail course S W by S wind E
Middle and better light breezes So Ench
At 5 AM board one boat &c black fish &c lat track by ab 14-18
not yet lost

Monahan, Oct 5 Commenced with light breezes from the E
 Cavalry 5 W by S All day long sail down at bark
 Machine to the Ward inside and latter pleasant
 Weather and light breezes Saw 2 ships so much

Tuesday Oct 6 Commenced with pleasant weather and
 light breezes from the N W & Course S S W off
 Drawing Sail one watch improved saw a ship heading
 to the Westward saw it hove back well and
 latter light breezes and cloudy weather So ended

Wednesday Oct 7 Commenced with light breezes from
the N.W. & S.E. cloudy with passing rain squalls
One vessel employed Course S.S.W. Smith Light
Buoys and cutters latter light breezes and variable
barbarian tracks on board heading to the south and
Eastward

Thursday Oct 8th 1848

Bay with light breeze and variable At one PM
 More ships leaving S S E Starboard Tacks on board
 one watch employed on ships christa Middle and latter
 light was heading to the south and east round Starboard
 Tacks on board At 4 PM saw a ship so much
 distant that no observation

Friday Oct 9 Commenced with light breezes and
calm. Course S by W at 1 P M. A light breeze
from the W N W at sunset breeze from E
One watch employed in bill calm at 9 A M
A light breeze from the N N E course S W by S
All hands employed darning down tops mast rigging &c

Saturday Oct 10 Begins with light breeze from the
N by E & Course S by E. All sail and all hands
Employed on rigging. Saw 4 ships heading to the Southward
North and latter light breeze and calm heading
to the South and westward. So ends

Sunday Oct 11 Begins with light breezes and calms
 heading to the S and westward All hands
 employed saw eleven sails heading to the S and
 westward middle and latter light breezes At eleven
 PM speak Brig Minerva of London bound to Pernambuco
 36 days out later part saw a number of brigs seen
 A whale ship bound to the S supposed to be
 the vessel of New Bedford Sa. Encls

Monday Oct 12 Begins with light breeze and cloudy
breezing to the S^W harbor tacks on for I
A number of sails in sight at 6 pm a small
down the S^W heavy rain more ships middle ground
Pleasant Breeze making S^E All sail latter light
Breeze A number of sails in sight 6 pm

Tuesday Oct 13 Breeze l with a calm sea water
 English spoke the ship's Vaneas of Timberport
 47 days from Newber 19 boats & P middle gentle breezes
 Starboard Tacks on last part of the time fair wind
 Course S by W making squalls latter part light
 Breezes. Saw heavy rain squalls in the middle of Sea
 In sight heading to Southward. No clouds
 No observation
