Monday February the 15th
Commenced with a pleasant breeze from the N.E.
Course S.S.E. Spoke the bark Barbra of Glasgow
49 days from London bound to Valparaiso
At sunset took in sail middle and latter part
strong breezes and cloudy. At 8 AM had a
the wind & barometer ticks at 10.00 So En 45-41.8
Saw one ship lat

Tuesday Feb 16th Commenced with fresh gales and cloudy
from the N.W. W. barometer ticks at 10.00 moderate
sail At sunset took in sail middle & latter part the
lat 44-50
long 52-54 W.

Wednesday Feb 17th Began with fresh gales and rainy
weather from the N.W. W. Short sail barometer
ticks at 10.00 At 5-30 PM took in sail fore
middle and latter blowing a gale fog and rain so
No at

Thursday Feb 18th Commenced fresh gales from and rain
from the N.W. W. barometer ticks at 10.00 saw a
great number of finbacks At 2 PM light breeze
clear weather At 6 PM six ships in sight At
7 took in sail were ships blowing a gale of wind
from the N.W. W. and rain. And I heard lines
of a voyage here middle and latter blowing a gale
of wind At 8 AM had the fore sail heavy signal
two sails in sight lat 45-21.5
long 49-50 W.

Friday Feb 19th Commenced with a gale of wind
from the S.W. barometer ticks on board one ship
in sight middle and latter part light breeze
sun & gale the above ship in sight so En 45-31.8
49-17 W.

Saturday Feb 20th Commenced with light breezes
and variable all sail out heaving to E wind
At 5 PM Spoke ship Nera of Greenport
Capt Case bound home At sunset took in
sail At 8 PM Capt Dexter went on board
of the Nera took home middle light breeze
At 7 AM Capt Dexter and Capt Case came on
board of the Israel At 8 left for the Nera
Made all sail course S.S.E. light breezes from
the N.W. wind So En 45-1
lat 45-1
long 48-51 W.
