

Shipboard Near the Hawaiian March 18:47
 Sunday March 14 All these 24 hours gentle breeze from
 N by E and fine pleasant weather we steered course S by E with
 All sail set so endy with the Barometer falling Lat obs 37° 07' S
 Long for Chro 2° 30' W

Monday March 15 th 7 months out today with 160 bbls Oil
 First part of these 24 hours light breeze from N by E and pleasant
 weather ship head S by E under all sail latter part much the same
 being light breeze at 10 A.M. saw a ship standing to the Eastward
 No employed seeing shroudsail gear and getting up the boom
 And sailing so endy Lat obs 37° 22' S
 Long for Chro 2° 58' W

Tuesday March the 16 th
 First part light air from N by E and pleasant weather ship
 head S by E with all sail set 1 ship to the Southward seen
 So the Eastward latter part wind backed to the North we steered
 E by S at 8 A.M. set the shroudsail this day crossed
 the Meridian which puts our reckoning on day
 Ahead so endy Rhoda Green on of the Boat Sticks
 Of duty with the crew it has been growing upon her
 The last 6 days and much others of our crew are complain-
 ing of sore hoars Lat obs 37° 11' S
 Long for Chro 1° 08' East

Wednesday March the 18 18:47
 Commence with increasing breeze from West and passing
 clouds we steered E by S carrying all sail and making the
 Best of our way to the first point of Entry at 4 P.M.
 The wind hauled to the S by W at this time the Barometer
 falling at 29.9 with thermometer at 67° middle squally with
 topsails and shroudsail wind hauled. A little to the South
 latter part wind from S by E we steered by the the wind
 to the Eastward with all sail set saw a Barque standing
 East so endy Green sick and other complaining of lameness
 Lat obs 38° 12' S
 Long for Chro 4° 18' East

Thursday March 19 th 18:47
 All these 24 hours strong variable wind and passing clouds
 No maid & took in sail as required ship head from S by E
 to E by E now new topsail clewings required Lat obs 35° 20' S
 Long for Chro 7° 24' E

Friday March 20 th
 All these 24 hours back breeze from S by E and passing
 clouds we steered to the Eastward to the best advantage
 with all sail three men sick and others complaining
 of lameness so endy Lat obs 33° 51' S
 Long for Chro 9° 35' East

This day for misconduct we had to look up on of
 the crew in the mizen rigging But by the own fault
 he was turned off to his duty of labor & behaved
 for the future

Sunday March 21 st
 All these 24 hours fresh variable wind and variable weather
 ship head by the wind E by S to E by E we carried all sail
 Not anything remarkable this day Lat obs 32° 51' South
 Long for Chro 11° 28' East

Monday March 22 nd
 All these 24 hours fresh breeze from S by E and
 fine weather with sun & passing clouds ship head
 East & E by S latter part S by E & E by E during
 the 24 hours we had maid and E by E and the most
 part were headed to the Southward of E by E then at
 this time 24° North variation and strong current setting
 to the Northward, four sick men getting worse so endy
 Lat obs 32° 18' South
 Long for Chro 12° 18' East

Tuesday March 23 rd
 First part gentle breeze from South and fine weather
 ship head S by E with all sail set, middle fresh gale from
 S by W ship head S by E in topsails latter part gale
 increasing we took in sail as required at 11 A.M. based
 ship to the S by W so endy with sun rain no star
 Lat by DR 32° 25' S
 Long for Chro 13° 26' East

Wednesday March 24 th 18:47
 Commence with fresh gale from S by E and a large sea we
 standing to the S by W under double reefed topsails middle part
 more moderate made sun sail latter part strong wind
 and squally ship head S by W under close reefed for 3 miz-
 sen topsails & double reefed main so endy with a large
 sea & cloudy weather 3 men sick of duty Lat obs 32° 46' S
 Long for Chro 12° 50' E

Thursday March 25 th
 First part strong wind from S by E and rugged ship head
 S by W under close reefed topsails & courses middle part
 strong gale in jib and main sail latter part more
 to gale with a large sea ship head S by W single reefed
 topsails so endy squally 3 men sick as usual
 Lat obs 33° 37' South
 Long for Chro 11° 45' East

Friday March 26
 Commence with strong wind from S by E and squally we
 standing to the S by W under easy sail at 1 P.M. set the
 main topsails at 3 fresh squall from East took in and
 made sail as required latter part maid all sail ship head
 S by E fitted new flumish hooves for the maintop sail gear
 I think if the wind stands to the Eastward much longer we
 shall be full as bad as the flying Dutch man that is as
 much talked of by Seamen so endy this day
 Lat by DR 34° 45' South
 Long by sun 11° 15' East
