

Ship James Allen outwards bound
Saturday Dec 21st 1844

Still fresh winds, weather clear steering
N^W, middle and latter part squally rainy
and calm 2 ships in sight Lat 19° 36' Long 57° 10'

Sunday 22nd

Squally and rainy steering N^W, middle and
latter part the same 3 sail in sight winds
variable with a heavy swell from N^W, sounds
rainy Lat by D^R 20° 30' Long 37° 30'

Monday 23rd

Still rain and light air from N^W, middle
and latter part the same at daylight saw the
Cassander amongst whales bore of the Boats
without success whales yalms sound

Tuesday 24th

Lat by D^R 31° 38' Long 38° 05'
Rain disagreeable weather steering N^W by E
middle and latter part the same sounds

Wednesday 25th

No Obs by D^R 22° 10' Long 38° 38'
Still squally rainy and calm at daylight
commenced steering N^W & then to East-
ship running D^R Lat 23° 25' Long 38° 27'

Thursday 26th Fair weather, employed in steering

Obs winds East steering D^R our sails in
sight Lat by D^R 25° 05' Long 39° 12'

Friday 27th Still fair weather, bore of D^R Mudd

East, middle and latter part fine
weather, sounds Lat 27° 27' Long 40° 16'

Saturday 28th Winds N^W weather fine running D^R

with all drawing sails middle part fine
latter winds N^W heavy weather, sounds

Sunday 29th Lat 30° 10' Long 41° 12'

Fresh winds from N^W and heavy weather
running D^R at midnight winds came to
the N^W double reefed the Topsails soon as
D^R Lat 32° 39' Long 41° 45'

Monday 30th Squally at 6 AM winds came to the South at 8 PM

went to the N^W by N at 8 AM from the hauls to the
D^R sounds under close reef Topsails with a heavy
from South Lat 33° 32' Long 42° 27'

James Allen for Cape Horn

Tuesday Dec 31st 1844

Fresh gales from SE, middle part from SE
latter from SE steering D^R sounds

Wednesday Jan 1st 1845 Lat 36° 22' Long 42° 14'

Commenced with fresh winds from N^W
steering South, middle and latter part fresh
Sailed from North steering D^R by N^W took in
the Trawl and B^R Boats day full thick & rainy

Thursday 2nd Lat by D^R 39° 36' Long 43° 51'

Still thick and rainy at 1 PM winds hauled
to the N^W quite moderate, saw a right whale
water green middle part rainy with light
winds and a heavy swell, latter part fine and
pleasant winds came to the North steering

D^R sounds Lat 41° 06' Long 44° 15'

Friday 3rd Still fine and pleasant middle and

latter part squally at 6 AM winds hauled to the
D^R about ship to the West Lat 42° 12' Long 45° 27'

Saturday 4th Breeze winds from South, middle

part squally from a strong current setting
to the N^W latter part fine and pleasant
winds a head Lat 41° 18' Long 46° 39' since 46° 39'

Sunday 5th Fair weather heading South, middle

part fresh winds from N^W, ships under
double reefed Topsails a heavy sea running
sent down the Fore & main Top Gallant M^{ds}
sounds rainy Lat by D^R 42° 55' Long 48° 18'

Monday 6th Still blowing strong at 2 PM took Fore

& sail and main Topsails close reefed the
Fore and main Mast 2 Top Galut Standing
Sail Borne 3 rough part turned up the
Starboard Boat at 7 PM more moderately
made sail to the D^R by the middle middle
and latter part light air and calm

Tuesday 7th Lat 44° 06' Long 48° 14'

Calm with a heavy swell water green caught
a few fresh sounds calm

Lat 45° 57' Long 48° 56'
