

Ship's Tails Allen bound down the Coast
Saturday Feb 8th 1845

Light airs from SE and thick weather, minding
winds came to the W weather fine and clear,
heading to the N under short sail at daylight
commenced sailing Lat 45 12 Long 80 30

Sunday 9th

From weather, middle and, latter, part light
winds from W employed sailing

Monday 10th Lat 44 02 Long 79 39

Light winds from West steering North at
sundown close reefed the Topsails, left to
the winds heading N.W. at daylight started
N winds light from SE Lat 42 54 Long 79 20

Tuesday 11th This day begins with light winds from
SE and fine weather, steering N.E. at 5 P.M.
finished sailing close reefed the Topsails
and to in the fore at daylight made sail and
steered N.E. Lat 41 41 Long 78 00

Wednesday 12th

Moderate winds from SE middle and
latter, part fresh winds from the same point
at 10 P.M. hauled the m. Topsails to the mast
by 10 until daylight then started off N.E.

Thursday 13th Lat 40 18 Long 76 30

Fresh winds from SE and cloudy middle
and latter, part moderate, weather thick
steering N.E. Lat 39 30 Long 75 00

Friday 14th

Light winds from W and squally middle
part the same latter, fine weather, winds from
N.W. water, breeze Lat 37 29 Long 74 44 Lunar

Saturday 15th

Lat 35 39
Fine clear at 2 P.M. saw the Island of
Mocha, bearing N.E. dist 50 miles at
sundown calm and clear no alterations
through the night at daylight took a light
wind from SE started in for the land
sailed Lat 38 29 Long by Lunar 74 30
by clock 74 38

Sunday Feb 16th 1845

Light winds at sundown calm, Mocha bearing
E. dist 30 miles middle and latter, part moderate
breeze and variable, our sail in light breeze

Monday 17th Lat 37 55 Long 75 15

Moderate winds from N.W. at 5 P.M. spoke
Bark Samson of New Port (Capt Potter 27 p. m. out
6 to 8 by winds Lat 37 14 Long 75 24

Tuesday 18th

Light breeze from N.W. and fine weather, heading
N.W. middle and latter, part light airs from
N.W. winds Lat 36 11 Long 76 00

Wednesday 19th

Light airs from N.W. and fine weather,
middle and latter, part the same working off
shore winds Lat 36 00 Long 77 40

Thursday 20th

Still fine weather, with light airs from N.W.
middle and latter, the same at 10 A.M. past the
Bong (regularly steering E. N.E. Lat 35 15 Long 78 37

Friday 21st

Light winds from N.W. and fine weather,
at 4 P.M. past a Bark Ship steering N.E. at
sundown took in sail middle part light and
at daylight saw Juan Fernandez, bearing N.W.
dist 30 miles at 10 A.M. and dist 25 miles

Saturday 22nd

Lat 34 09 N. Altitude
Light airs and fine weather, middle and
latter, part winds variable at 7 A.M. saw
Massafuro bearing W. dist 50 miles
Lat 33 55 Long 80 59 Island
bearing West dist 30 miles

Sunday 23rd

Still fine at sundown bearing N.W.
dist 30 miles middle part hazy in with the
lands at 7 A.M. sent 2 Boats in for fresh sounds
lying off and on 3 ships in sight
