

Ship James Allen bound off Thors
Monday Feb 24th 1845

Leaving off and on the East side of the
Island at 3 Boats returned with a quantity of
fish on boat 3 Fowls and a Peck of Potatoes
made sail to the SE, middle and latter part
fresh winds went round the Island saw several
sails round the Island bearing E by N dist 10 miles

Tuesday 25th Lat 33 30 Long 80 32

Fresh winds from SE at sundown double
up the Topsails at daylight saw three
bearing E by N dist 30 miles at meridian 99 E
dist 30 miles Lat 33 25 Long 80 50

Wednesday 26th

Fresh winds from SE beating to the
Island at 7 AM close in to Cumberland and
harbour attacked off under short sail at 7 AM
Boat went on shore obtained nothing came
on board and stuns to the SE under short
sail Lat 33 25 Long 80 30 78 3

Thursday 27th Fresh winds from SE middle and
latter part this same steering SE at 7 AM
past a Brig steering West Lat 32 Long 75 50

Friday 28th

Fresh winds from SE middle and latter
part this same at 9 AM stuns to SE under
double reefed Topsails Lat 29 34 Long 79 58

Saturday March 1st 1845

Fresh gales from S middle and latter
part this same steering SE under short sail

Sunday 2nd Lat 27 14 Long 76 09

Fresh winds from S and N at sundown
close up the Topsails at daylight made
sail stuns to SE Lat 28 06 Long 76 32

Monday 3rd Fresh winds from SE and N at
sundown took in all sail except close reef
and hauled to the wind for a day East middle
and latter part light breeze and fine weather
making SE Lat 24 12 Long 74 20

James Allen bound down the coast
Tuesday March 4th 1845

Fine and pleasant at sundown double reefed the
Topsails middle and latter part light winds and
fine weather steering E by N Lat 23 36 Long 73 00

Wednesday 5th

Fine weather at sundown shortened sail at
daylight made sail to the SE by N round fine
weather No Obs supposed to be 23 20 Long 71 30

Thursday 6th

Pull fine weather middle part lay heading
East with the main topsails to the mast at
daylight made sail to the E by N round fine
weather Lat 23 27 Long 72 30

Friday 7th

Fine weather steering E by N at meridian
saw the Bell of Mexico bearing E by N dist
40 miles Lat 23 00 Long 70 45

Saturday 8th

Pull fine weather at sundown the Bell bearing
E by N dist 25 miles wore ships and headed off
shore middle and latter part calms land in
sight dist 30 miles Lat 22 54

Sunday 9th

Calms at 3 PM took the Northies moderate
stuns off SE middle part light airs and
calms spoke a Brig bound to Cobagua

Lat by Obs 22 56 Long 20 00 miles

Monday 10th Fine weather at 2 PM stuns to SE
middle part calms at daylight commenced
steering SE round light air from SE

Tuesday 11th

Lat 20 54 Long 71 35
Pull light air middle and latter part the
same round Lat 20 08 Long 73 00

Wednesday 12th

Light airs and calms all the 24 hours
round Lat 19 34 Long 74 17
