

Ship James Allen bound into Tacamas
Thursday May 15th 1845

Begins pleasant middle and latter
part cloudy sounds Lat 5 m N Long

Friday 16th

Still cloudy at 4 P.M. saw this land which
proves to be Cape Pissadore bearing
E by S dist 35 miles at daylight close in with
the land sounds running for Tacamas Lat 45 N

Saturday 17th

Running for Tacamas at 9 P.M. came to
Anchor in Tacamas roads in 4 fathoms
water, sent a raft into the river, & latter
part one Boat at the Town and one watering

Sunday 18th

Fine weather, employed watering middle
part foggy latter part one watch on shore

Monday 19th liberty sounds

Employed getting off water, and recruits
one watch on shore at sundown all returned
except Asa Holbrook Louis P. Blair and Wm
Matumau a Black skamp middle part
rainy latter part fair all hands getting

Tuesday 20th water sounds

Good weather, getting off water, and
recruits succeeded in catching the runaways
and put them in the Galepoda for sale

Wednesday 21st keeping sounds again

Getting off recruits & one watch on

Thursday 22nd liberty sounds

Still getting off recruits and going on liberty

Friday 23rd

This day J. A. Mills deserted not worth

Saturday 24th looking for watches still on liberty

Fine weather, at 7 A.M. took off the runaways
flogged one for running away and slapping a
man on shore gave him 18 lashes with 3 part of
worming sounds all hands on board

Ship James Allen at Tacamas
Sunday May 25th 1845

Now ready for sea at daylight went on shore
and shipped a man at 7 P.M. returned took
the Anchor and stood out by the winds W. N. W.

Monday 26th

Lat 53 miles N

Brisk trades saw a Ding stung to the N
middle part under, short latter part heading
off W. N. W. sounds Lat 1.43 N Long 81 41

Tuesday 27th

Fresh winds and fine weather, middle
and latter part cloudy Lat 2.18 N Long 82 28

Wednesday 28th

Cloudy weather, plenty of Black pelts
middle and latter, this pump find a
strong current setting to the E. N. E. sounds

Thursday 29th

Lat 2.51 Long 83 14

Fresh winds and fine weather, winds S. W.

Friday 30th

Lat 2.47 Long 84 21

Good weather, and strong winds at sundown
Tacked to the S. E. middle and latter fresh
winds sounds Lat 1.49 N Long 83 2

Saturday 31st

Fresh winds and made current beating
to the S. W. sounds Lat 2.4 m N Long 82 07

Sunday June 1st 1845

Strong winds at sundown bout Ship to the
W. middle part latter part heading up to the W.
one pair in sight Lat 2.0 m N Long 83 51

Monday 2nd

Still fresh winds at 4 P.M. spoke a Ding
from Payta, bound to P. de America middle
fresh winds latter part moderate, winds S. E.
sounds course S. W. by W Lat 48 m N Long 86 00

Tuesday 3rd

Moderates and fine weather, steering S. W. by W
under all sail middle and latter part the
same sounds as any Lat 129 9
Long 87 20
