Monday Sept 15th 1845

Fresh trades and squally weather, trying to get to the Eastward found Lat 43 Long 111 52

Tuesday 16th

Strong winds and squally again found

Wednesday 17th Lat 5.11 Long 111 15

Winds strong in fairs, middle and latter part squally found Lat 5.10 Long 110 40

Thursday 18th

All this day squally disagreeable weather

Friday 19th Lat 4.49 Long 110 13

All these 24 hours brisk winds and squally a heavy swell setting from the West found

Saturday 20th Lat 5.46 Long 109 46

This day fair weather, beating to the Eastward

Sunday 21st Lat 4.34 Long 108 44

All this day fine weather, found

Monday 22nd Lat 4.28 Long 108 00

Fine weather, at sundown saw whales lower struck stove 3 Boats and went off spouting

Boats, middle and latter part fair employed mending Boats Lat 4.18 Long 108 00

Tuesday 23rd

All the 24 hours fair weather, mending Boats

Wednesday 24th

Still good weather, working to the Eastward and mending Boats found

Thursday 25th Lat 4.30 Long 108.27

Moderate winds and fair weather, employed mending Boats Lat 5.30 Long 109 36

Friday 26th

Mending Boats yet, weather fine found

Saturday 27th Lat 5.27 Long 109 30

Fine weather, all the 24 hours employed mending Boats Lat 7.49 Long 109 05

Sunday 28th

Fine weather, moderate winds found heading to the Eastward Lat 6.43 108.11

Monday Sept 19th 1845

Weather fair wind strong all the 24 hours found this day Lat 5.35 Long 107 25

Tuesday 30th

At 10 fine weather, at sundown saw whales went down saw them no more found squally Lat 5.10 Long 107 15

Wednesday Oct 1st 1845

Squally middle part this same at 6 A.M. saw whales going to the East at 10 P.M. saw them again to windward found whales in sight Lat 5.24

Thursday 2nd Strong winds and overcast weather

Whales still in sight at 3 P.M. lower got nothing at 6 came along side and stood to the N.E. middle and latter part strong wind and overcast weather, saw a ship steering N.W.

Friday 3rd Lat 5.29 Long 107 23

Fresh winds and fair weather, middle part the same latter part saw a ship at 10 spoke her the Capt James, Capt Church 35 Mo out 2000 bbls spun out saw her get a whale found

Saturday 4th Lat 4.50 Long 107 12

Strong winds and overcast weather, heading to the Southward Lat 5.31 Long 106 52

Sunday 5th

Strong winds and cloudy weather, standing to the N.E. middle and latter part squally

Monday 6th Lat 4.50 Long 105.24

All the 24 hours strong winds and squally heading by the middle N.E. Long by 104 08

Tuesday 7th

Strong winds and cloudy, heading to the N.E. found the day N.E.

Wednesday 8th

Fresh winds and fair weather, heading to the N.E. saw Porpoises middle and latter part cloudy found Lat 11 M P
