

Ship James Allen bound in to Tacamas
Tuesday Nov 18th 1845

Fine weather, heading off NW middle and
latter part thick with some rain sounds

Wednesday 19th Lat 1.32 N Long 86 33

All this day moderate winds and cloudy
weather sounds Lat 1.26 N Long 85 13

Thursday 20th

Fine weather, all the 24 hours but no whales

Friday 21st sounds Lat 30 m N Long 83 13

Fair weather, &c bound into Tacamas sounds

Saturday 22nd Lat 4 m N Long 82 53

Still good weather, at daylight saw the land
at 7 A.M. spoke the Alagash 16 m out 24 m
out 90 bbls sounds running for Tacamas

Sunday 23rd

Good weather, running down the coast at
4 P.M. spoke the Elderly of Palau 65 bbls
middle and latter, fine weather, running for
Tacamas sounds N.O.

Monday 24th

Still good weather, at 2 P.M. came to anchor
in Tacamas Roads in 4 1/2 fathom water, sent
a Raft into the River, but could not fill it.
latter part watering and &c sounds

Tuesday 25 took off 150 bbls water, weather good

Wednesday 26 Trying to get off water, tide to low

Thursday 27 Still watering our watches on liberty

Friday 28 Blacking Benas &c one watch on liberty

Saturday 29 Getting more water, and giving liberty

Sunday 30th

Getting more water, one watch on shore
at sundown 4 m out took to the mountain
latter part getting off plantains &c

Monday Dec 1st 1845

Still here on ways still in the mountain
getting ready for sea sounds

Tuesday 2nd fair weather, at daylight caught the disordered
and took them on board, and flogged 3 of
them so much they were for sale

James Allen bound on a C.M.S.
Wednesday Dec 3rd 1845

Still good weather, all ready for sea sounds

Thursday 4th

Fine weather, at 4 P.M. took the anchor and
stood to sea heading NW middle and latter
part fine one pair in sight

Friday 5th

Lat 1.9 N Long 81 27

All this day fine weather, waiting whales

Lat 1.21 N Long 82 33

Saturday 6th Fair weather, all the 24 hours ship heading
off shore NW sounds Lat 52 m N Long 83 57

Sunday 7th

Weather still fair trying to get to windward
mud, out 22 m N Long 84 41

Monday 8th

Begins moderate middle and latter part
strong winds sounds Lat 5 m N Long 83 00

Tuesday 9th Fresh winds all the 24 hours sounds

Lat 1.12 N Long 81 47

Wednesday 10th Fresh winds and fine weather,
at 3 P.M. saw the land of Laplat bearing to N.E. dist
40 miles at sundown bore to dist 10 miles boat
ship stood off to the west middle and latter
part fair weather, sounds Lat 1.33 N Long 82 07

Thursday 11th

Still good weather, at 4 P.M. saw Point St
Medine bearing to N.E. dist 30 miles at daylight
N.E. dist 30 miles sounds Lat 2 42 Long 81 55

Friday 12th

Weather good water, Green course N.E. with
all pair at midnight part at Clara at 4 A.M.
closed in off Tumber Bar at 6 started for the
shore, at 8 landed sounds flying off and

Saturday 13th

Boat on shore at 3 P.M. boat came off engaged
100 bbls of Potatoes to be brought off in a barge
stood off all night at daylight stood in at 10
am saw the land off Point Benas &c sounds running
off Lat 32 4
