

James Allen of the Salapagos Islands
Tuesday Feb 30th 1845

Fine weather, working out the Bay middle and
latter, part fair heading for Northrough sounds

Wednesday 31st



Moody weather, at 3 PM saw whales close in to
Cape Hammond down boats at 5 struck at dark
took along side hook down with the boats to
lower the ship some rain soon took a turn off the
land at 9 PM at daylight hooked down at 7 finished
and made sail to the 9th sound Lat 43 N. L

Thursday 1st Jan 1846

This day begins with fine weather at 4 PM commenced
boiling at 6 spoke Bark Franklin Warren R. I.
Capt Boston 28 mo out 1000 lbs sperm oil middle
part some rainy latter part fair at 11 AM finished
boiling 2 ships in sight so made heading into weather
Bay

Friday 2nd Fine weather at 4 PM sent a Boat with
fish at dark returned with about one dozen heads
forward and stood out of the Bay to the 4th
middle and latter part rainy and squally
sounds 9th sound 15 m dist

Saturday 3rd Still rainy and squally middle and
latter part the same at daylight began to storm
at sounds off 9th sound

Sunday 4

Employed stowing oil at dark finished
middle and latter part fair weather standing

Monday 5th in for the 6th sound Lat 1.30 Long 91 10

Good weather at sunset Point Christ born 16
dist 40 m middle and latter part squally
and rainy stowing oil Lat 1.26 Long 91 30

Tuesday 6th Begins fine but under short part middle
and latter part mist of rain at 11 PM saw
a large whale going to windward and to
lower sounds stowing oil 9th sound under
our lee

James Allen off the Salapagos Islands
Wednesday Jan 7th 1846

Light winds and squally at sunset saw 3
9th sound bearing N dist 18 miles middle and
latter part rainy and squally sounds

Thursday 8th

Lat 1.24 Long 91 30

Still this day squally and rainy heading in
for the 6th sound at midnight 9th sound
bearing N dist 8 miles sounds

Friday 9th

Still squally and rainy at 1 PM saw whales to
windward lower but whales going to fast
at sundown saw them again breaching to windward
middle and latter part squally still off the 6th
Lat 1.05 L

Saturday 10th

Fair weather at sunset 9th sound bearing N
dist 20 m middle and latter part squally and
rainy heading in for the 6th sound bearing to 510 m

Sunday 11th

Squally and rainy within 4 miles of Boat
Cove at 1 PM saw whales lower down and
killed one at 4 took to the ship at 6 with ship
and headed off 9th with whale along side at 10
were in shore at daylight took one at 10 m
finished one pair in sight to lower sounds off
the mouth of Ebralette Bay made sail and
headed off at 5 PM took a turn into the bay

Monday 12th

Rainy and squally at 6 PM commenced boiling
middle and latter part fair on ship in
sight sounds boiling in the mouth of Ebralette bay

Tuesday 13

Fair weather at sunset Point Christ born
dist 10 m heading out of the bay at 10 PM
brought ship and stood in sounds in the bay

Wednesday 14th Some squally and rainy
some rainy at 4 PM finished boiling 9th sound bore
dist 30 m middle and latter part fair
at daylight stood in sounds Lat 1.41 L 92 20
