

Passes Allen on the Coast of Peru

Wednesday July 29th

Fresh winds and cloudy heading in shore
by the wind, finished stowing Oil &c middle
and latter part heading to N.E. saw Fish Bucks
& Blackfish, sounds Lat 7 35 Long 84 30

Thursday 30th

Strong winds and overcast weather heading
to N.E. saw more Blackfish middle part this
same latter part moderate saw Blackfish and
Porpoises Lat 6 40 Long 82 30

Friday 31st

Fresh winds and fair weather, steering to N.E.
more Blackfish and Porpoises middle part
the same latter part moderate saw Lat 6 3 Long 81 40

Saturday August 1st 1846

Light winds and cloudy at 3 P.M. saw a large
Whale trailing to N.E. dist 20 miles at sunset
tacked off shore middle part moderate latter
part the same running down the land Lat 5 45

Sunday 2nd

Fresh winds and fair weather, running for
Payta Head at sunset the Whale bore N.E. by N.
dist 10 miles shifted to the wind heading N.W. by N.
middle part lying off and on at daylight Payta
Head bore N.E. dist 12 miles sounds working
up the harbour.

Monday 3rd

Fine weather at 1 P.M. came to anchor in
Payta harbour in 7 1/2 fathoms water middle and
latter part fair on watch on shore sounds

Tuesday 4th

Fair weather on watch on shore
latter part Larboard watch on shore sounds

Wednesday 5th

Fair weather, Larboard watch on shore latter part

Thursday 6th Larboard watch on shore sounds

Harboard watch on liberty all returned

Friday 7th

Latter part Larboard watch on liberty sounds
Larboard watch on shore at sunset all returned
Except the Carpenter who went to latter part
all hands on board sounds

Bounded to Tumbes

Saturday 8th Lying at Tumbes Payta middle part the
same at 11 A.M. took the anchor and lying
for the Capt sounds

Sunday 9th Strong winds lying off and on at Payta
at 7 P.M. stood to sea latter part heavy steering
N.W. along the land sounds Lat 4 43

Monday 10th

Long 81 33

Strong winds and heavy weather, running
down along the land, called Cape Blanco
middle part lying aback latter part running
the land down Lat 3 48 Long

Tuesday 10th

Light winds and fair weather, running for
Tumbes middle part lying aback at daylight
kept off a land course one ship in sight
steering the same way sounds Lat 2 38

Wednesday 10th

Breeze winds and fair weather, running
the land down at sunset sent a Boat
along side of the Tarranda Capt Brown, 7 mo
out clean like the Norman 16 mo out 150 2/3
150 whale middle part lying off and on latter
part the same sounds Lat 13 24

Thursday 13th

Lying off and on at 4 P.M. came to
anchor in 5 fathoms water at 6 the Captain
of Nantucket came to anchor 31 mo out 150
The Dr. latter part took a raft up the river
sounds

Friday 14 Lifting up the Shores and getting ready
to tow off water latter part lifting up the
the Lido so low could not get the raft off

Saturday 15th

Employed painting the mast and getting
up the Shores latter part the same sounds

Sunday 16th Lifting up the Shores & latter part all hands
towing off water sounds

Monday 17 Employed watering latter sent the
raft up the river sounds
