Saturday Sept 5th 1846

Fresh winds and fair weather, 2 sail
in sight at 6 Boats returned with 5 Serapim
and a quantity of meat middle part cloudy
latter part fair 3 Ships in sight at 11 AM spoke
the Constitution of Nantucket Capt Barker
4 1/2 pm out 1600 Ws sounds off Marlborough

Sunday 6th

Fresh winds and fair weather, 2 Ships in
sight at 5 PM spoke the Aurora Capt Coffin
15 ms out 900 middle part calm latter
part running down for Banks Bay 2 Ships in
sight sounds Lat 00 Long 91 39

Monday 7th

Light winds and fine weather, at sunset
Cape Berkeley bore E dist 8 Mo middle
part standing off by the winds at 7 AM saw
Whales at 8 AM at 10 struck and killed
one sounds chasing the Phoebe No Obs

Tuesday 8th

Brisk winds & Boats still in chase at
5 PM took the whale along side and cut
in middle part heading to the SE at
7 AM saw whales at 9 hours struck and
killed one saw a dead whale sounds 2 Boats
in chase Lat 42 N Long

Wednesday 9th

Light winds at 4 Boats came along side
hooked on at 6 finished cutting middle
part clearing away latter part running
off N. W. Marlborough and N. Head in
sight saw 5 Ships Lat 18 N Long 91 38

Thursday 10th Standing to the North Rodondo Rock
in sight N. Head 10 m dist at sunset
buffed to with the M Topsails to the mast
middle part Boiling latter part standing to
the N sounds Boiling
Lat 34 N

Friday Sept 11th 1846

at sunset the sun and Islands bearing N. E
dist 15 m middle part by the winds latter
part standing by the winds to the S. M. by M

Strong winds and overcast weather, heading
S. M. middle part the same latter part S. W. by S

Sunday 13th

Lat 22 N

Fresh trades and fair weather, heading S. W. by S
middle and latter part winds light steering S. M.

Monday 14th

Lat 14 N Long 96 48

Light winds and fair weather, saw Porpoises
middle and latter part the same saw Furback

Tuesday 15th

Lat 28 N Long

Light trades and fine weather, heading S. W. by S
middle and latter part the same sounds

Wednesday 16th

Lat 13 S

Still light winds saw Furbacks and Porpoises
middle and latter part the same employed
minding the forecast, Lat 2 35 Long 99 48

Thursday 17th

Light winds and fine weather, saw Porpoises
middle and latter part the same minding
sails Lat 3 40

Friday 18th

Brisk winds and clear weather, steering
S. M. middle part by the winds latter
part steering S. M. Lat 4 28 Long 101 30

Saturday 19th

Brisk winds and fine weather, anchoring
off middle part by the winds latter
part steering S. M. employed showing bolt
in the after Mast Lat 5 17

Sunday 20th

Brisk winds and fair weather
at 3 PM saw whales going to the S. E
lound in chase without success middle
and latter part by the winds saw Porpoises and
B fish Lat 5 36 Long 102 58
