middle and latter part light winds

off the islands one ship in sight Lat 1 43 Long 90

Sunday 18th Light and at sunset Charles I

bearing N by M dist 20 m took in early

middle breeze wind latter part the

same 2 ships in Charles I 15 m first

Monday 19th Lat 1 31 Long 90 35

Breeze winds 2 ships in sight at sunset

Charles I bearing N by E 40 m first sound

light breeze latter part running off towards I Maca 2 ships

and a Boat in sight Lat 1 09 Long 90 56

Tuesday 20th Breeze winds I Maca 15 m first at 5

P.M. spoke the swift middle part heading

at 8 A.M. sent 2 Boats to get treasure met

returned except Simmons who we suppose
