

## Passage from New Bedford

Saturday Sept 22<sup>nd</sup> 1877.  
Commenced heaving again the wind  
hauling into the S.W. vessel steering E  
under the Lower Top Sails and Fore  
brig employed making sunset no change  
this twenty four hours

Lat 38° 25.  
Long 54° 25.

Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup>  
Had fresh breeze from the S.W. all  
the first & mid part. latter part moderated  
some vessel steering E.

Lat 38° 49.  
Long 50° 08.

Monday 24<sup>th</sup>  
Moderated. Wind hauled into the S.W. set  
the top Gallant Sails again kept the hands  
busy about deck and in the rigging saw  
a sail

Lat 38° 30.  
Long 50° 05.

Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup>  
Had light breeze from the S.W. all this  
day vessel working Eastward. employed the  
sailing cutting sails & or saw 1 black fish  
and lowered dished get guns

Lat 38° 40.  
Long 53° 25.

Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup>  
Had Calms and Light air employed  
at work in the rigging so ends

Lat 38° 25.  
Long 52° 15.

## to the Equator

Thursday Sept 27<sup>th</sup> 1877.  
Calm all this Day employed about Decks  
and in the rigging saw nothing

Lat 38° 21.  
Long 52° 03.

Friday 28<sup>th</sup>  
Got a breeze from the S.W. broke out  
water and done several small jobs in the  
rigging

Lat 39° 08.  
Long 50° 20.

Saturday 29<sup>th</sup>  
Wind hauled to Eastward vessel steering  
into the S.W. saw a flock to windward  
nothing more of note.

Lat 38° 05.  
Long 47° 25.

Sunday 30<sup>th</sup>  
Had moderate breeze from the Eastward  
all the first part. Mid part wind died  
off. Calm latter part got a breeze from  
N.E. S.W. vessel steering S.W.

Lat 37° 26.  
Long 46° 05.

Monday Oct 1<sup>st</sup> 1877.  
Wind hauled into the S.W. and commenced  
heaving stowed the top Gallant Sails  
nothing more of note
