

At Ocean Crossing

Sunday Dec 3rd

Commenced with light breeze from the N.W. and clear weather, about 2.5 m commenced raining with S.W. wind raised S.W. breeze and cleared and the S.W. breeze of S.W. wind going on and the breeze from S.W. while rocking it and started the rollers to raised until dark and gave them up. Latter part of evening wind raised into the N.W. sailing most of night.

Monday 3rd

Light breeze from the S.W. and rain. Latter part of evening weather and fresh breeze from N.W. to N.E.

Lat. 43° 52'.
Long. 75° 19'.

Tuesday Dec 4th

Clear weather with fresh breeze from the N.W. and thick fog. Latter part of evening wind more westerly with frequent squalls and rain breeze strong Northward.

Wednesday 2nd

With strong breeze from the N.W. raised S.W. breeze going off into the N.W. cleared and got to follow took him alongside and got supper then set the watches on star called all hands and looked on got the head off and took in fine weather and wind beat so ends.

Thursday Dec 8th 1878.

Wind hauling into the N.W. and breeze got the head in and case sailed Northward of 3.15 got the watches. Mid part of evening the S.W. breeze down 4.15. started the watches. Latter part of evening strong from the N.W.

Lat 45° 21'.
Long 75° 23'.

Friday 9th

Commenced with strong S.W. wind finished the head and started on sail. Mid part of evening wind from S.W. quarter and weather threatening. Employed sailing at sea.

Saturday 10th

Wind hauling into the N.W. barometer falling. Mid part of evening from the N.W. finished sailing. Latter part of evening determined entering harbor and out port. Broke out water and got ready to stop over oil.

Lat 45° 27'.
Long 77° 27'.

Sunday 11th

Weather clear & settled wind about run the head oil down and worked the vessel. Mid part of evening S.W. breeze and squally.

Monday 12th

Head clear weather and fresh breeze from the N.W. sighted soon. sunset at 6.15 in sight to the N.W. Mid part of evening wind hauling into the N.W. latter part of evening finished stowing down. Saw Hump back at sea.
