

Cruising

Tuesday March 19th 1878.

Had moderate breeze from the S.E. and fine weather vessel steering S. employed heaving out. Shows mid part hauled up. A.M. & A. Day break kept off. Vessel employed setting up & hooking and scraping spars.

Wednesday 20th

Wind let go & hauled out. S.E. vessel steering into the S.E. set up fore & aft back stage sunset. Hoisted top sails mid part wind changed more to Westward and with rain so ended.

Thursday 21st

Became with thick weather wind Westward vessel heading into the S.W. under short sail mid part were ship and stood into the S. weather lighted in some latter part moderate breeze and thick weather nothing of note occurred this day.

Friday 22nd

Had moderate breeze from the W. saw the bark A. Barker and spoke the Birch Perry. latter part clear weather and moderate breeze from the S. saw 8 whales in sight.

Saturday 23rd

Had moderate breeze from the S. spoke the Lucia. Sea Fox. Mary & Susan. Matilda Sears & Abner Parker also several merchantmen so ended.

Cruising

Sunday March 24th 1878.

Had moderate breeze from the S.W. vessel working into the Eastward all this day spoke the bark John & Bartholomew.

Monday 25th

Had fresh breeze from the S. vessel working to windward all day spoke the Cape Horn Piccon & hauled also a bark to windward called the P.P. West. washed ship nothing more of note this day.

Tuesday 26th

Had strong breeze from the S. spoke the S.E. & Georgia. Vessel saw several Finbacks nothing more of note.

Lat 37° 30'

Long 75° 24'

Wednesday 27th

Flowing strong from the S.E. vessel laying easy under lower S. sails & short St. Bails.

Lat 37° 17'

Long 74° 24'

Thursday 28th

Comingers with strong breeze from the S.E. vessel steering S. all the first part. Mid part tacked off shore daylight tacked on made the haul and kept off saw several sail nothing more of note.
