

At Salcamayo

Friday March 29th 1878.

Had Thodrate. Breyer from the S about 9 PM came to anchor in Salcamayo Bay stowed the light sails and set the watch. Day light got under way and came up to the anchorage passed the remainder of the day washing ship outside.

Saturday 30th

Had fine weather employed getting up Purchase Tackle and go sunset sent the watch ashore. Daylight the watch came off. employed the remainder of the day hoisting Oil.

Sunday 31st

Fine weather finished the top tier and put 402 gallons on board the Bark John G West for shipment sent the watch in as usual. Daylight the watch came off and sent the other ashore on liberty rainy.

Monday April 1st 1878

Calms and light airs from the N. Day light the watch came off put 4399 galls of Oil on board of the J. G. West sunset sent the watch ashore as usual.

Tuesday 2nd

Had fine weather Day light the watch came off as usual put 4197 galls Oil on board of the J. G. West. Cooper employed setting up Shocks sunset the watch went in. sold a Hog of Butter 100 lbs to J. G. West.

At Salcamayo

Wednesday Apr 3rd 1878.

Daylight the watch came off put our Spade Top Mast & S. G. Yard ashore and broke out Shocks and setting up sunset sent the watch in as usual sold a spare boat.

Thursday 4th

Had good weather employed getting up Shocks scraping Chain plates & painting and doing several other jobs about the vessel sunset sent the watch in as usual.

Friday 5th

Had fine weather employed getting up Shocks and setting up Shocks. gave the machine a good black & sent out some other things ashore sunset sent the watch ashore.

Saturday 6th

Had fine weather employed getting up Shocks sunset sent the watch ashore as usual.

Sunday 7th

With fresh breeze from the S daylight the watch came off. Willie Morrison and Frank Long relieving at breakfast and sent the port watch on liberty nothing more of note this day.

Monday 8th

Wind hauled into the S daylight the watch came off. Henry came aboard employed till day setting up Shocks and painting. Sunset sent the watch ashore as usual.
