

St. Salcahuana

Friday Apr 19th 1878.

Had fine weather and wind from the S. the greater part of this day employed setting up shore and painting watch went and came as usual.

Saturday 20th

Had fine weather got off some of our recruits and also some painting washed the vessel in and the watch went and came as usual.

Sunday 21st

Had fine weather daylight the watch came on board George Ready a seaman missing after breakfast put the Port Watch ashore on liberty.

Monday 22nd

Good weather daylight the watch came off Adolf Kuhn carpenter missing got off the remainder of our recruits sunset hoisted the boat on the crane setoped night liberty.

Tuesday 23rd

Moderate weather and wind (S) got the vessel ready for sea put Frank Long and Charles Stillwell in prison for drunkenness and misconduct.

Wednesday 24th

hazy waiting for a wind to get out. nothing of note occurred this day.

St. Salcahuana

Thursday Apr 25th 1878.

Clear this morning took up anchor and towed out side the shiping latter part blowing a Gale from the S and raining dropped second anchor got our seamen on a board.

Friday 26th

blowing from the S and raining officers standing watch nothing more of note.

Saturday 27th

Moderate some breeze up the Port. Anchor rainy and foggy all this twenty four hours.

Sunday 28th

Weather lighted and wind hauled out. nothing of note this day.

Monday 29th

This day began with fine weather and good breeze from the South. latter part took our anchor and proceeded on our voyage. Wind light and baffling.

Tuesday 30th

Commence with light airs from the S.W. sunset. Quiriquina Light bearing about S.E. by E 5 miles distant. Wind light. latter part breeze from the S.W.

Wednesday May 1st 1878

Commence with fresh breeze from the N.W. about 2 P.M. wind shifted into the S and steering to sunset shortened sail. latter part made sail and steered N.W. painted the anchors and done several other jobs.
