

Bound off Shore

Thursday May 2nd 1878
Had fresh breezes from the S vessel
steering S.W. sunset. Luffed to and
shortened sail. Latter part kept off
S.W. and made sail. overhauled
the Windlass nothing more &
note.

Friday 3rd
Had fresh breezes from the S about
4 P.M. sighted San Francisco sunset
shortened sail and wore ship. Mid
part wind died out. Calm. Latter
part got a breeze from the Westward
hauled the Windlass. Copper setting
up. Clear.

Saturday 4th
Commenced with fresh breezes from
the Westward sunset the Island
bearing about S.W. 20 miles. Mid
part. Breezing. Latter part raining
and blowing strong from the West.

Sunday 5th
Cleared off made some sail and
stood in toward the Island. Mid
part shortened sail and stood off
into the S.E. Latter part made sail
and steered W by S wind from the
S.E. S.W. and fine weather. Lat. 34° 45'.
Long. 80° 07'.

Monday 6th
Commenced with moderate breezes
from the S vessel steering W by N &
N.W. sunset shortened sail and wore
about into the S.E. Daylight wore back
and steered N.W. by W. Massafusa in
sight ahead. Put out water & provisions
saw a sail to leeward so made

Off Massafusa Cruising

Tuesday May 7th 1878
Had light breezes from the S spoke the
Back of Stamboul sunset the Island bearing
about W 20 miles wore ship and stood into
the Eastward Daylight wore back in
shore the wind gradually hauling into
the Westward and breezing.

Wednesday 8th
Fresh breezes from the West vessel steering
into the S. Mid part wind hauled around
S. Latter part wind S.W. and moderate nothing
of note occurred this day.

Thursday 9th
Commenced with light airs from the
S.E. vessel steering into the S.W. all the
fore part. Mid part wind hauled more
to Westward vessel working into the S
the remainder of the day.

Friday 10th
Began with light breezes from the West
with squalls of fog & rain and continued
so all through this twenty four
hours.

Saturday 11th
This day began with moderate
breezes from the S.W. weather cleared
off ran in under the Island and
went fishing caught about 300 lbs and
cleaned and salted them. Latter part
with fresh breezes from the Westward
saw the sail.

Lat. 32° 58'.
Long 81° 43'.
