 Tuesday June 4th 1878
 Blowing strong from the N.E. with
 rain during the first part
 Mid & latter part wind from
 the S.W. broke out water

Wednesday 5th
 Blowing strong from the S.W.
 all this twenty four hours with
 frequent showers of rain

Thursday 6th
 Wind hauled into the Westward
 and cleared of pleasant latter
 part Strong breeze and squally
 saw a Merchantman

Friday 7th
 Strong breeze and clear
 weather till greater part of the
 day broke out water and
 saw a Sail

Saturday 8th
 Commenced with moderate
 weather the wind hauling
 into the S.E. Mid part
 the wind hauled back N again
 and continued the rest of the
 day got the main & gallant sail
 out for again saw a Merchantman

Sunday 9th
 Breeze from the E and raining
 storm till Upper 7th Sails Mid
 part moderate and wind hauled
 out & latter part calm

 Lon 82° 34'

Off Massachusetts
 Monday 10th June 1878
 Commenced with pleasant and light
 airs from the S.W. Mid & latter part
 fresh breeze from same quarter saw
 three backs

Tuesday 11th
 Had strong breeze from the S.W.
 all the first part Mid part wind
 hauled into the S.W. daylight fresh
 off & by 4 and made sail then
 wind blowing strong and rugged

Lat-30° 19'
 Lon 82° 26'

Wednesday 12th
 Blowing fresh from the S.W. vessel
 starting S.W. Mid part hauled up
 S.W. & the wind moderating
 and hauling into the S.W. latter
 part light breeze from the S
 nothing of note occurred this day

Thursday 13th
 Had moderate breeze from the S
 and S.W. vessel working Northward
 saw several three backs nothing more
 of note

Lat-27° 47'
 Long 80° 28'

Friday 14th
 Commenced with moderate breeze
 from the S.W. vessel starting
 into the S. and S.W. employed
 the time at work in the rigging
 also in fixing up of the forehead
 Boats sighted the Island of St. Brelif
