

Cruising

Thursday Oct-22nd 1878

Commence with fresh breeze from the Westward vessel under reefed top sails & courses a bit mid part blowing & raining vessel under lower top sails & stay sails again

Wednesday 23rd

Blowing a gale from the N.W. vessel laying easy nothing of note observed this day no work

Thursday 24th

Blowing from the S.W. mid part moderated some latter part fresh breeze from the S.W. vessel heading into the S.E. made some sail employed the time putting life lines on the yards and doing several other small jobs about deck

Lat 42° 45'
Lon 77° 45'

Friday 25th

Commence with fresh breeze from the S.W. gradual heading into the N.E. again vessel steering into the S under all sail broke out fresh latter part wind calmed more to S vessel steering into the Eastward

Cruising

Saturday Oct-26th 1878

Commence with fresh breeze from the S & S.E. with frequent squalls mid part blowing from same quarter stowed all but Lower top sails & stay sails and wore ship latter part moderate vessel steering into the Eastward

Lat 44° 08'
Lon 76° 20'

Sunday 27th

Commence with fresh breeze from the S vessel steering into the Eastward mid part wind hauled into the E.S.E. stood into the S all night latter part wore ship and stood into the S.E. under all sail made the land about half way between Socorro & Quaffo also saw a large steamer bound to Southward & made

Monday 28th

Breeze with light breeze from E.S.E. tacked into the S under Socorro blowing S.E. by E about 35 miles mid part wind hauled into the S.E. stood in close under the Island and kept off into the S.W. saw a sail to leeward and called it a whaler

Tuesday 29th

Commence with fresh breeze from the North spore the bark part Howland and had a gale and picked up a dead Right-Whale took him alongside of Howland to render aid let her have our share of case nothing more of note
