

Cruising

Monday Nov 18th 1878
Commence with baffling winds
from the W & S vessel working
into the S.W. passed close to
the Jacob Howland nothing
more of note

Tuesday 19th
Begin with fresh breeze from
the S & S.E. vessel steering into
the S.W. latter part wind
hauling into the Westward
again saw the J. Howland and
fleeting to windward

Lat 46° 25'
Lon 78° 40'

Wednesday 20th
Begin with moderate breeze
from the W employed working
Barn and repairing fore & aft
stay sail pendant spoke the
J. Howland just taken a right-
whale and reported the fleet
having taken another mid & latter
part wind S.W. with fog equally
vessel steering S. & E. saw several
humpbacks

Thursday 21st
Begin with strong breeze from
the S.W. with frequent fog equally
mid & latter part much the same
broke out - heat nothing more
of note

Friday Nov 22nd 1878
Begin with clear weather and
strong breeze from the W mid part
blowing & raining latter part
moderate saw 8 humpbacks & whales
nothing more of note

Saturday 23rd
Began clear weather and good
breeze from the Southward
spoke the Bark Fleeting & Jacob Howland
latter part raised the Bark Lancer
to leeward whaling run down
to her and landed in company
with Fleeting whale went to
windward gave up and came
onboard

Lat 46° 20'
Lon 79° 23'

Sunday 24th
Moderate the Lancer & J. Howland
in sight to leeward right-whaling
run down and chased the
Fleeting struck and we all
retained for our respective vessels
mid & latter part breeze from
the S.W. with frequent squalls
of rain

Monday 25th
Begin with strong S.W. winds mid
part blowing latter part moderated
made some sail broke out water
nothing more of note
