

Cruising

Sunday Dec 22nd 1878
Wind hauled into the West
vessel steering into the S.W.
under all sail saw the Milton
to windward. Wind a latter part
with strong breeze saw Gimbade
nothing more of note

Monday 23rd
Begins with strong breezes and
thick weather vessel working
into the Westward nothing
of note occurred Lat 46° 52'
Lon 81° 31'

Tuesday 24th
Begins with strong breezes from
the S.W. vessel steering into
the S.E. spoke the bark
Jacob Cleveland & Birch Fern
also saw another whaler at noon
latter part blowing a Gale
Lat 46° 30'
Lon 82° 58'

Wednesday 25th
Begins with a Gale from the S.W.
vessel laying easy under lower top
sails and storm stay sail latter
part stowed the fore top sail
three Whalers in sight so made

Thursday 26th
Blowing heavy. Wind part-moderated
some latter part. Good weather
vessel steering E.S.E. broke out
water Lat 45° 42'
Lon 83° 20'

Cruising

Friday 27th 1878
Begins with fresh breezes from the
S.W. vessel steering S.E. caught
two porpoises sunset shortened sail
and lifted two Daylight. kept off
S.E. weather thick and breezy
employed washing bone

Saturday 28th
Begins with strong breezes and
thick fog from the S.W. Wind part
wind hauled into the S and
cleared off latter part. Blowing
a Gale stowed the fore top sail
main stay stay and storm speaker
vessel laying easy Lat 46° 01'
Lon 81° 52'

Sunday 29th
Begins with a Gale from the S.
with frequent squalls of rain & hail
latter part kept off E.S.E. and set
the top sails fore and fore sail
Lat 45° 40'
Lon 79° 56'

Monday 30th
Begins with a moderate Gale from
the S vessel steering E.S.E. Wind
part shortened sail latter part
kept off E.S.E. and made some
sail washed the remainder of our
bone nothing more of note
Lat 45° 10'
Lon 77° 05'
