 saw Humpbacks and Blackfish

Friday 7th
 Clear and good breeze from the
 S caught a Blackfish latter
 part-boiled him nothing
 more of note

Saturday 8th
 Fine weather and light air
 from the S repaired the
 lower top sail and caught
 three Blackfish two salmon
 in sight to eastward nothing
 more of note

Sunday 9th
 Light breeze from the S with
 frequent fog squalls latter
 part-clear saw the Milton
 Cape Martin and Racatia rocks
 off for the north

 Lon $75^{\circ}12'$

Monday 10th
 With light air from the S
 mid part-Calm latter part-
 breeze from the S saw
 the Jacob Howland boiling
 the Lloyd bearing S 20 miles
 vessel heading off shore as
 ends

Tuesday Feb 11th 1879
 Wind caught into the S.W. the
 vessel steering into the S.W.
 latter part-light air from the
 S vessel steering S.W. under
 all sail

Wednesday 12th
 With light air from the S.
 mid part-wind hauled into the
 S.W. spoke the Bark Jacob Howland
 and latter part-fresh breeze
 from the S. broke out
 Water

Lat $+2^{\circ}50'$
 Lon $76^{\circ}10'$

Thursday 13th
 Fresh breeze from the S. mid
 part-wind died out Calm
 scraped the spars nothing more
 of note

Lat $+2^{\circ}37'$
 Lon $75^{\circ}50'$

Friday 14th
 Got a light breeze from the S.W.
 vessel steering S.W. by S

Lat $+1^{\circ}26'$
 Lon $75^{\circ}45'$

Saturday 15th
 Moderate breeze from the S.W.
 latter part-blowing S from vessel
 steering S.W. by S under power
 employed washing the
 paint-work saw four whales
 all steering off nothing more
 of note

Lat $+1^{\circ}37'$
 Lon $75^{\circ}25'$
