

Salcahuano

Wednesday Feb. 25th - 1879.
Left air from the vessel
during P.M. sunset tooked
off the land close to and
thick weather latter part
clear and good breeze from
the S stood into the Bay so
ends

Thursday 27th
Fine weather and good breeze
from the S about 4 P.M. came
to anchor in Salcahuano
harbor sunset - sent the Star
watch ashore on Liberty Delight
watch came off all strait employed washing
the vessel out-side discharged Charles
Stillwell seaman and sent the coxswain
ashore

Friday 28th
Fine weather washed the lower masts
sunset - sent the watch ashore latter
part employed breaking out - Petroleum
Decks

Saturday 29th
Fine weather painted the lower
masts and primed over the
bar places out-side the watch
went and came as usual

Sunday 30th
Fine weather Starboard watch
ashore on Liberty

Monday 31st
Fine weather painted the
Star side and commenced on
the Port

Salcahuano

Tuesday April 1st - 1879.
Good weather employed breaking
out oil for ship's use watch
went and came as usual

Wednesday 2nd
Wind hauled around into the
S with rain employed pumping
oil & co

Thursday 3rd
Good weather the greater
part of this day shipped
4443 gallons of sperm oil by the
Ship Emma & grease and 1416 pounds
of Bone

Friday 4th
Good weather employed painting
and stowing back the ground tier
watch went and came as usual

Saturday 5th
Wind S and clear employed
painting nothing more of note.

Sunday 6th
Blowing strong from the S with
rain Port watch ashore on Liberty

Monday 7th
Cleared off and wind hauled
into the S got off some lumber
and 15 bbls of Flour nothing more
of note

Tuesday 8th
Fine weather finished stowing the ground
tier and got off Sugar, gold & brass
of Ladin shore and one barrel of Blush
nothing more of note
