

Salcahuano

Wednesday April 9th 1879.

Good weather employed getting off recruits sold 289 lbs of brown Cotton and 193 yds of Drillings

Thursday 10th

Wind N and backing with frequent showers of rain Starboard watch on Liberty

Friday 11th

Wind N and raining Hot Water ashore on Liberty

Saturday 12th

Good weather got off the remainder of our recruits and got ready for sea

Sunday 13th

Good weather nothing more of note

Monday 14th

Got our cruises aboard and hauled out nothing more of note

Tuesday 15th

Good weather and good breeze from the S Chatter part - Capt. Lane off and we got under way in company with Ship pink Key

Wednesday 16th

Backing from the S vessel steering West - under reefed top sail and fore sail nothing more of note

Thursday 17th

Strong breeze from the S vessel steering West - employed breaking out - S hoisted

Cruising

Friday Apr 18th 1879.

Strong S winds vessel steering N W & W sunset Juan Fernandez bearing about West - 20 miles latter part cloud in view near the Island spoke the Sautiles

Saturday 19th

With strong breeze sent the boats in and got off 4 foot loads of wood latter moderate got off the remainder 12 cords in all

Sunday 20th

With fresh breeze from the S vessel working up S of the Island Chatter part with light-buffing winds from the Westward

Monday 21st

With light-buffing winds from the S & West - latter part - with air from the S & S vessel working into the S W got the wood below hatch and washed off

Tuesday 22nd

With Calms and light-air from the S Chatter part - Calm employed blacksmithing & c

Wednesday 23rd

With Calms & light-air from the Westward vessel steering into the S broke out - provisions latter part - with good breeze from the S & S vessel steering West - Massapean in sight ahead
