Saturday May 17th 1879.
With strong breeze and
thick weather put the ^{fore} boat out again and done
several small jobs Blacksmithing
nothing more of note.

Sunday 18th
With strong breeze from the
Westward nothing more of
note.

Monday 19th
Blowing strong and raining
the greater part of this
day washed the paintwork.

Tuesday 20th
Moderate breeze took the
fore boat on deck for repairs
Miz and Chatter parts with
strong breeze from the North
Massachusetts bearing about
E distance 70 miles.

Wednesday 21st
Strong breeze from the E.
Chatter part. Moderated
some repaired the fore
Chatter sail. saw a Whaler
to seaward.

Thursday 22nd
Fresh puffing breeze from
the North-east. Miz & Chatter
part. Moderated spoke the
Sautiles nothing more
of note.

Lat - 33° 20'
Lon 82° 50'

Cruising

Friday May 23rd 1879
With light dip and calm
during the first & mid part.
Later part good breeze from
the Westward vessel steering
E by S.

Saturday 24th
Strong breeze from the West
Mid part wind shifted into
the E. saw the Sautiles
and Napoleon broke out
water.

Sunday 25th
Moderate spoke the Sautiles
and Napoleon nothing more
of note.

Monday 26th
With fresh breeze from the E.
vessel working to windward
under all sail.

Tuesday 27th
Moderate breeze from the E.
spoke the Sautiles and Napoleon
on board of her.

Wednesday 28th
Wind hauled into the E.
vessel steering into the Eastward
all this day broke out
provisions nothing more of
note.

Thursday 29th
With light baffling breeze
from the E by S. the Island
bearing about N by E distant
85 miles.
